

Chicago Museum Librarian to Direct Library at University

Carl W. Hintz, now librarian of the Chicago Natural History museum, has been named to replace Dr. R. C. Swank as librarian at the University of Oregon effective September 1, 1948. Dr. Swank has resigned to accept the position of director of libraries at Stanford University.

Appointment of Mr. Hintz, an-

nounced Tuesday by President H. K. Newburn, is subject to approval by the state board of higher education.

Mr. Hintz, a naturalized citizen, was born and received his early education in England. Before coming to America he attended a gymnasium in Germany. He was graduated from high school in South Bend, Ind., after coming to the United States, later receiving his bachelor of arts degree from DePauw university, baccalaureate degree in library science from the University of Michigan, and master of arts degree in library science from the University of Chicago graduate library school. He has been continuing his graduate study at Chicago, working toward a doctorate.

The background of experience in library work was started for Mr. Hintz in 1930 when he was a student assistant in the DePauw University library. When he went to Michigan university in 1932 he continued in the library while taking graduate work. He became head of the circulation department of DePauw's library in 1933 and then assistant librarian, leaving in 1937 to go to the University of Maryland as director of libraries. In that capacity he was responsible not only for the College Park libraries of the university but for those in Baltimore, including the medical and dental schools and other health units along with the schools of pharmacy. He remained at Maryland until 1946 when he accepted the position of librarian of the Chicago Natural History museum, and continued his advanced study at the University of Chicago.

Mr. Hintz has had experience in academic work, teaching at Maryland, at Catholic University of America and during the past year at the graduate library school of the University of Chicago. He has written numerous professional articles for library publications.

Commission to Probe Fireman's Suspension

The Eugene Civil Service Commission will conduct a public hearing Wednesday evening to review the suspension of Fireman Richard Cauthorn. The hearing will open at 7:30 p.m. in the mayor's office and will be conducted by Commission Chairman Arthur Hendershot.

Cauthorn has been suspended from the fire department staff for 15 days upon action of Fire Chief E. L. Surfus. The chief has listed insubordination as the reason for the action.

Clarinet Trio Stars Concert

The regular weekly concert of the Eugene Municipal Band will be Thursday at 8 p.m. in the park blocks, and will feature a clarinet trio of Shirley Hostick, Julia Warner and Gladys Stone.

The band will be conducted by Arthur S. Haynes, who will be making his last guest appearance. The three solo performers are all graduates of the University of Oregon and have made numerous individual solo appearances. They also have played with the University and municipal bands for several years.

Six-Children Family Adopted

PORTLAND, Ore., (AP)—Three brothers and three sisters, ranging in age from two to seven years, were officially members of six new families Wednesday—all members of the Central Church of Christ.

Adoption proceedings were completed before Circuit Judge Donald E. Long of the Multnomah County Court of Domestic Relations Tuesday.

The mother and father of the six youngsters separated in February, 1947. Their names were withheld by the judge.

The mother was forced to give up the children early this year because of illness. And when she continued in ill health, she asked Rev. L. D. Webb, minister of the Central Church of Christ, to find affectionate, Christian homes for them.

Rev. and Mrs. Webb took the youngest child, a boy. After extensive investigation, Rev. Webb found homes for each of the other five youngsters, with members of his church.

The adoptions were made formal Tuesday, with all of the children and their new mothers and fathers in court at the same time.

Said Judge Long: "This is the greatest number of children I have ever adopted out from one family."

The judge expressed pleasure that all six of the youngsters were going permanently into "good Christian homes."

Heavy Albacore Tuna Cargoes In

ASTORIA — (AP) — Heavy cargoes of albacore tuna have been taken off the Pacific Northwest coast the past few days.

Seven boats have made heavy deliveries at Newport and Depoe Bay and report many of the tuna were being taken just a few hours run offshore. Skipper Bill McClure delivered 1666 pounds at Depoe Bay. At Astoria, the Active II unloaded 1300 pounds Tuesday.

Usually the tuna runs have been about 100 miles off shore and later than the fish have appeared this season. Prices have not been set, but one buyer was offering \$500 a ton Tuesday.

The great white shark, one of the largest, swiftest and most voracious of sharks, reaches a length of 40 feet.

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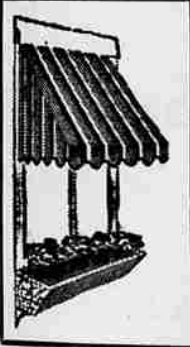
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
