Alaska Power Projects Seen
WASHINGTON — (U.P.) — Secretary of Interior J. A. Krug said Friday he will ask Congress to authorize Alaskan water power projects "at an early date."

Krug said investigations are beginning now in the territory for development of her rich water-power resources.

"One of the most pressing" needs is a power development at Eklutna Lake, he said, to meet the requirements of Anchorage, the electric cooperatives in Matanuska Valley, the Alaskan railway and Indian service installations.

Other studies will include possible power sites at Sitka, Juneau and Ketchikan where power is needed to develop a pulp industry to ease the United States' newsprint shortage.

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California's Scientists Fight Cotton Boll Rot
SAN FRANCISCO — (U.P.) — The cotton boll rot, a new disease to California, is being studied by plant disease men of the University of California College of Agriculture.

Such questions as how the infection occurs, how it spreads and how it lives between seasons are being investigated thoroughly, it was announced by Byron R. Houston, Davis plant pathologist. From that information, the best control measures will be worked out, he said.

Last season, when the disease was first discovered, Houston proved it was caused by fungus. Damage ranged up to 85 per cent in some fields. The disease is also called blue-loc and hard-loc.

Raw Foods and Milk Advised for Ulcers
SAN FRANCISCO — (U.P.) — If you are afraid of stomach ulcers, you may do well to include raw foods and fresh milk in your diet.

That conclusion was reached by Dr. Garnett Cheney, scientist at Stanford University's school of medicine, after tests conducted with guinea pigs.

A diet rich in vitamin U, found in raw foods and milk but deficient in heated foods, reduces peptic ulcer occurrences, a university bulletin said. The importance of the findings depends on whether the human stomach behaves exactly like that of guinea pigs, the bulletin added.
