St. Alice Catholic Church To Be Formally Dedicated

Keeping pace with the rapid growth of population and construction at Springfield, the new St. Alice Church and rectory in the recently formed Catholic parish of Springfield will be formally dedicated Sunday, July 18, at 10 a.m. by the Most Reverend Edward D. Howard, D.D., Archbishop of Portland.

The dedication and blessing of the church and rectory will be followed by the Mass to be said by His Grace, Archbishop Howard, who will also deliver the occasional sermon. The ceremony will close with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

The Springfield parish was officially formed September 4, 1947, when the area was designated as a parish and Father L. H. Sohler was appointed as first pastor.

An Army chapel was purchased at Camp White, Medford, and on January 23, 1948, work of dismantling and transporting the structure to Springfield began.

The building measures 95 by 38 feet and besides the church includes a suite of six rooms attached to the east end of the structure which will serve as a rectory.
