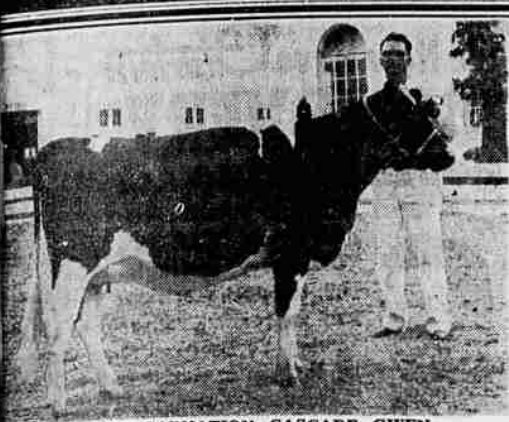

Symington Sees Air Necessity

LOS ANGELES — (AP) — "You cannot win a war without air superiority and you cannot lose one with it," says Air Secretary J. Stuart Symington.

"The American taxpayer has placed his money on air power," he declared Monday night at a banquet of the Institute of Aeronautical Sciences. "It is the best possible defense against possible attack by any power."

Symington scoffed at any concept of American isolationism. "The protection of the two oceans," he said, "has been ended forever by the discovery and flight over the so-called Polar Route."

The secretary congratulated the assembled air technicians and scientists on such achievements as surpassing the speed of sound, new refueling techniques which add great range to bombers and other developments. He especially praised the B-36 bomber which, he said, performs at maximum range better than any bomber now operating.

Earlier at a press conference, the air secretary said the Air Force will rely largely on volunteers to build up to the 70-group limit. He expects only 15,000 recruits through selective service and many times that number from the air training program and from voluntary reassignment of air crewmen trained in World War II.

Regarding the sending of B-29 superfortresses to England for "training," Symington said: "We just want to show them that our B-29s can get around if necessary." He did not elaborate.

He predicted great improvement in the performance of American jet fighter planes, adding that recent U.S. models of P-51 and P-47 propeller fighters have about reached their maximum in performance.

A highlight of the IAS banquet was the presentation of awards to two pilots for outstanding achievements in aviation.

Hoover Honored
Herbert H. Hoover, test pilot for the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics, received the Octave Chanute award for being the first man to fly a plane faster than the speed of sound.

James M. Gillespie, a former Air Force colonel who commanded the push-button plane flight across the Atlantic last September, received the Thurman H. Bane award for that achievement. Gillespie acknowledged the honor by saying the flight took teamwork by his crew. The award carries an honorarium of \$200.

GREENVILLE, Miss. — (AP) — Bob May, local businessman, has a unique warehouse, made entirely of surplus Army tentpoles.

May bought 50,000 surplus tentpoles last year. He couldn't find a market for them and was stuck for a use until he got the idea for the warehouse.

The building is about 180 by 600 feet. Except for the aluminum sheeting on the outside, concrete block foundations and a few stray pieces of regulation lumber, nothing but 20,000 tentpoles went into the structure.
