Ashland Actor's Royal Gown May Be Mi-Lady's Drapes

ASHLAND, July 20—While women from coast to coast are suffering under the ordeal of trying to adjust their wardrobes to the "new look," housewives in Ashland are going through even more troublesome times in keeping up with the last fashions of Queen Bess—the good Queen Elizabeth, ruler of England Scotland, that is.

Women here can speak with authority on the comparison of modern and Elizabethan dress, for a large number of them are busy helping to make eighty authentic Elizabethan costumes needed for the annual Oregon Shakespearean Festival. With only about half of the work completed now, they are willing to pay homage to the dressmakers of 1550 who had the patience to turn out such magnificent apparel.

Ladies of the festival sewing group are amazed at the work which goes into turning out even one garment, and they are assured that each costume is an authentic reproduction of the clothing worn in England 400 years ago. A great deal of study has gone into the preparation of the costume designs, for the director of the festival, Angus E. Bowmer, believes that much of the success of the colorful summer festival is due to the elaborate and historically correct costuming.

The costumes for "Othello" and "King John," the other two plays of the 1948 season, are being worked out by Douglas Russell, Stanford University undergraduate who has come to Ashland this summer to supervise costuming.

Ashland homemakers were alerted during their spring housecleaning to be on the watch for old drapes, brocades, and velvets which might be useful, and the amount salvaged was most gratifying. A large portion of the costumes will be made from this material after it has been re-dyed to suit the needs of the plays.

Many Ashland women will be thrilled when the festival opens on August 11 to see the costume which she fashioned being flashed behind the footlights of Ashland's world renowned Elizabethan theater. And others will be equally excited to realize that King John's regal gown is actually only her old dining room drape retouched!
