

Murray Takes Montana Vote

HELENA, Mont.—(U.P.)—James E. Murray, Montana's senior senator, Wednesday had been nominated for reelection by Montana Democrats.

Murray was leading in all counties and had built up an edge of four to one over his single primary opponent, Dr. Henry J. McGregor of Great Falls, on the basis of unofficial returns from 480 of the state's 1142 precincts.

Most Decided

Most of the other contests in Montana's primary election appeared to be decided early Wednesday, as returns continued to pour in from throughout the state.

Tom J. Davis, Butte attorney and former president of Rotary International, was running well ahead of Wellington D. Rankin of Helena for the Republican senatorial nomination. Davis established a lead as the first precincts were reported and continued to hold it until he was more than

4000 votes in front early Wednesday.

Ford Leads

Republican Gov. Sam C. Ford, seeking nomination for reelection, held a lead of nearly four-to-one over his nearest opponent, Leonard C. Young, who conceded the election Wednesday morning.

In a red-hot contest for the Democratic gubernatorial nomination, John W. Bonner, Helena attorney and former state attorney general, increased an early lead over Arthur F. Lamey, Billings, to more than 5000 votes. Lelf Erickson, who defeated Sen. Burton K. Wheeler for the Democratic senatorial nomination in the 1946 primary, was running third, nearly 8000 votes behind Bonner.

Montana's two incumbent congressmen—Democrat Mike Mansfield of the 1st district and Republican Wesley A. D'Ewart of the 2nd—were unopposed in the primary.

Police Hold Man On Fugitive Warrant

Alfonzo John McLoughlin, 50, was arraigned on a fugitive warrant in justice court Tuesday and held for North Richland, Wash., police with his bail set at \$2500.

McLoughlin has used the names of Mills and Miller while in Eugene, city police said after his arrest. He is wanted in the Washington community for contributing to the delinquency of a minor.

Woman Lost in Hills Alerts Lane's Posse

Sheriff C. A. (Tom) Swartz reported Wednesday that the posse, Lane County's mounted patrol, had been called out again Tuesday night to search for a woman who was feared lost in the hills west of Eugene.

The woman was found unharmed about 7 p. m. just as the posse was preparing to start a search of the area. Sheriff Swartz said the family had asked for help when the woman failed to return home. They asked that her name not be disclosed, and said that she suffered from occasional attacks of mental illness.

Earlier the posse had been used to help locate a twelve-year old girl who had rented a horse from a local stable Sunday noon and then failed to return. She was found near Harrisburg Monday.

Bond Purchases Total \$58,189

Residents of Lane County purchased \$58,189 worth of U. S. Savings Bonds during the week ended July 10 to send the total to \$734,375 thus far for the drive. This represents only 47 per cent of the assigned quota.

Lane is now in 20th place in the list of 36 counties, and below the state average sales of 82 per cent of quota. Only one county, Curry, has achieved 100 per cent success.

A letter from state director Kenneth G. Martin, indicates that there will be one more weekly report of sales as of July 17 and a final report about the end of the month. This final report will show the purchases of F 7 G Bonds made during the period July 1-15 under the special Treasury Department ruling.

Workers in the county campaign expressed the belief that many firms would still establish Payroll Savings Plans for the benefit of employees. Individuals are urged to continue buying bonds in the nation's fight against inflation.

Guards Seek Life Prisoner

SALEM, Ore. — Prison guards are searching the state penitentiary grounds Wednesday for George C. Graves, 44, a life prisoner, who was missing from his job in the boiler room Wednesday morning.

Warden George Alexander said Graves, who was a night fireman in the prison boiler room, is believed to be inside the walls.

State police, however, have broadcast an alarm and conducting a search for the convict on the outside.

Alexander said Graves, who was given a life sentence on a conviction of armed robbery in Portland, was missed by guards at 5:30 a. m.

Graves had been in prison four times before he was given his life sentence in January, 1944.

His escape was the fourth in three days. Two of the other three were recaptured in Milwaukee and no trace has been found of the third.
