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GI Insurance Deadline Nears

To help veterans reinstate their GI insurance before the deadline Saturday night, July 31, the Eugene office of the Veterans Administration will remain open on that date from 9 a. m. to 5:30 p. m.
 Kenneth L. Farner, VA representative in this area, reported that all of the agency's offices in Oregon would accept reinstatements Saturday, which is normally a closed day.
 For the rest of this week, ex-GIs with lapsed term insurance may pay any amount back in force—from \$1000 to \$10,000—by certifying that their health is as good as it was when the policy lapsed.
 After the July 31 deadline, veterans whose insurance has been lapsed for three months or more will have to pass a physical examination to regain their policies.
 The VA office in Eugene is located in Room 202 Hampton Building.

Lane Teachers Urged To Submit Certificates

About 700 school teachers in Lane County were reminded Saturday that payrolls cannot be made up until all teachers have their contracts, health certificates, and teaching certificates filed in the county school office.
 Superintendent Lucille L. Klinge said that a number of teachers had inquired concerning vacancies in some 50 classrooms throughout the county, but that many would have to wait until their certification had been cleared through the Salem offices of the State Department of Education, before negotiation with school boards could be completed.

 Poole-Larsen Mortuary will have charge of local arrangements, and services and interment will be in Seattle, with Buriens Mortuary in charge.

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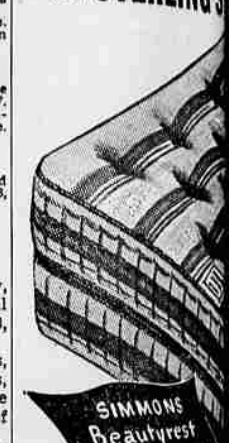
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
