Hearst Weds Mrs. Cassini

WASHINGTON, Va.—(U.P.)—Mrs. Austine Cassini, society columnist for the Washington Times-Herald, and William Randolph Hearst, Jr., publisher of the New York Journal-American, were married Thursday night at the home of the bride's parents here.

Only members of the families and a few personal friends witnessed the ceremony which was performed by Justice of the Peace Frank D. Gaskins of Warrenton.

The bride was attended by Miss Martha Rountree, radio producer and writer. Hearst, son of the founder of the newspaper chain, had his brother, Randolph Hearst of San Francisco, as best man.

Both had been married previously. Mrs. Cassini was divorced last year from Count Igor Cassini, who writes the "Cholly Knickerbocker" column for the Journal-American. Hearst and Lorelle McCarver of Dallas, Tex., were divorced early this year.

After a wedding trip to Canada and California, the couple plans to make their home in Washington and New York.

Two Sentenced In Circuit Court

Two out-of-state men received prison terms in Judge G. F. Skipworth's circuit court Friday morning.

Anthony E. Foster, Arkansas, who pleaded guilty to charges of obtaining money and property under false pretenses was sentenced to not more than five years in the penitentiary. Foster was accused by the district attorney of defrauding Montgomery-Ward by cashing two checks totaling \$50, claiming that he had the necessary funds in a Texas bank.

Robert Wesley Williams, Longview, Wash., was sentenced to not more than two years in the penitentiary. He was accused by the district attorney of taking and using a vehicle in Cottage Grove without the owner's consent. Williams, 21, was previously twice convicted for car theft, according to the district attorney.

In other court action, Lee Anderson, Eugene, pleaded guilty to charges of obtaining property under false pretenses. He was charged with writing bad checks for merchandise at the R. A. Babb hardware Co. totaling \$39.75.

Navy Again Accepting Enlistment Applications

Navy recruiters in Eugene noted Friday that they are again accepting "applications for enlistment" despite the fact that actual enlistments have been closed by the Navy until Monday, Aug. 2.

Over 400 Ask Road Repairs

More than 400 petitioners have signed and forwarded a request to the Lane County Court for improvement of Market Road No. 30, which runs around Dorena Dam from Cottage Grove to Disston.

They charge the road is in a poor state of repair and causes considerable discomfort and threatens damage to vehicles using it.

Residents of the area, representatives of city delivery merchants, and local lumber concerns were on the list.

Commissioner Walter Holland pointed out in accepting the petition that the section of the road which has shown the greatest deterioration is that laid by the federal government to replace the old one through the Dorena dam site.

"We will survey the bed, fill in where necessary and attempt to have it ready for re-rolling next year," said the commissioner Thursday.
