

Eugene Man Wins Award

Joseph H. Young, Eugene, has won the Ion Lewis scholarship in architecture in the University of Oregon, according to Dean Sidney W. Little.

The scholarship, established through a trust fund, is awarded on the basis of character, ability, and professional promise of the recipient matriculates in the university as a "traveling fellow."

Young was graduated from the university in June of 1948 with the degree of bachelor of architecture. He had previously studied at Indiana University and Indiana State Teachers college.

He will work on the project, "The Tradition of Wood in American Architecture," during his summer vacation. His work will carry him through several states and cities where significant historical architecture in wood is located.

He will visit architects to discuss their philosophies concerning domestic architecture and the regions they represent.

Water Plant Bid Openings Due

Bids on construction of the Eugene Water Board's new water filtration plant will be opened Monday in the municipal utilities offices at the city hall.

Part of a million and one-half dollar expansion project which will increase the capacity of Eugene's water system from around 12-15,000 gallons a day, the new filtration plant will be situated at Hayden Bridge.

The plant will replace the filtration system built near the city Eighth Ave. in 1932, and water from the Hayden Bridge filtration will be carried to Eugene through a six-mile steel pipeline, 45 inches in diameter, which already is under construction.

The contract upon which bids are to be opened Monday will cover only the construction of the control building and the filter units at Hayden Bridge. Equipment for the plant is to be purchased under a separate contract and will be installed by water board crews.

Excavation of the site and construction of concrete foundation walls has been completed.

Water board staff engineers indicated Saturday that the bids to be opened Monday may run in excess of one-quarter of million dollars.

Bethel Water Supply To Be Off for Hour

Bethel water district service will be shut off from 10 to 11 a.m. Sunday for repairs on a Eugene Water Board line, according to District Secretary Harry Ray who said he will assist the EWB men with the work.

Service affected will include all households in the district and the SP yards.

Interest Said High In Timber Disposal

Willamette National Forest officials have predicted high interest in the Winberry Creek sale of 48,000,000 board feet of timber here Monday.

The sale will begin at 2 p.m. in the forest service offices at Eugene Postoffice. The stand of timber is located on the north fork of Winberry Creek about 36 miles southeast of Springfield.

Appraised prices are \$24.55 for Douglas Fir, \$6.90 for cedar, \$3.10 for hemlock and other species. Taken into consideration in the appraised price is the need for construction of nine miles of new road and repair of about seven miles of existing road.

Other national timber sales this month include the Stevens selective cutting sale Aug. 9, and the Gray Creek sale Aug. 16.
