Dump Truck Crushed Up

A heavy dump truck owned by Wildish Trucking Co. was destroyed Thursday when it was squeezed between two other heavy vehicles on Franklin Blvd. near the intersection with Villard St.

Police reports showed that the driver of the dump truck, Lester V. Anstine, Elmer, was extricated from the wreckage and treated at a local hospital for shock and bruises.

Investigating officers said the Wildish truck was in the left lane of traffic, between a 1948 International truck and trailer and a 1948 Mack truck and trailer. Police said the dump truck could not get into the right lane and could not stop in time to avoid being squeezed between the other two heavy trucks.

The Mack truck and trailer, damaged to the extent of \$2000, was owned by Hall Heavy Hauling Company and driven by M. L. Grove of 591 Tenth Ave. W. Arthur Grande of Springfield was driving the International, which was not damaged.

Peterson had put St. Helens in the area, but in an amended order, Peterson removed the city, saying he had made an error in the original order.

The company says in its circuit court case that Peterson had no right to issue the amended order without a hearing.

The firm wants to sell its Portland milk in its St. Helens store.
