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Suit Disputes School Election

District 15 against Junction City School District 69 and the District Boundary Board in regard to a consolidation election held last June 2.
The plaintiff asks that the order of the District Boundary Board declaring the consolidation of District 15 with District 69 be declared "illegal and void." The plaintiff alleges that "at least ten of the voters" in School District 15 were "either not on the last assessment roll or are not property owners in the district," and thus the results of the election would be different.
The results of the election, according to the canvass of the District Boundary Board, were 44 to 41 in favor of the consolidation in District 15, and 18 to 0 in favor of the consolidation in District 69.
The plaintiff also claims that the District Boundary Board did not canvass the vote to determine whether or not the voters at the election were legal voters as "defined by law."
The District Boundary Board consists of the three members of the county court and the county school superintendent.

Count Pleads For Refugees

CAIRO — (P) — Count Folke Bernadotte says help must be extended quickly to 800,000 Arab refugees from Palestine to prevent still more suffering.
The United Nations mediator said in Alexandria that he has asked the Security Council to affirm the right of the homeless Arabs to return to Palestine. He added:
"One thing is sure—the need is enormous and the time is short because those people will suffer still more if we cannot give them help."
In reply to a question, Bernadotte said "it is quite true that some of the (Arab) houses in Jaffa and Haifa at least are already taken by Jewish authorities and Jewish private people."
He said Israeli authorities are "not very favorable" to the refugees returning. He said they mentioned two difficulties: The technical problem of moving people during the truce and because many Arab houses have been damaged or destroyed in fighting.
He said there are some Jewish refugees, but Israeli Foreign Minister Moshe Shertok told him that they are not numerous and the problem can be handled easily, Bernadotte said.
In Amman, King Abdullah of Trans-Jordan said the question of returning the Arab refugees to Palestine "is one of the tests to prove Jewish good faith."

Youth Problems Movie Shown

Civic leaders and officials attended a short movie Thursday morning in the McDonald Theater where ideas for a balanced program of action in handling youth problems was shown.
Among the 30 persons attending the film, "Report for Action," which dealt with basic problems and methods used in areas handling same, was the Eugene Police Department, whose chief, Keith L. Jones, had written invitations to community organizations and leaders.

No One Factor
"Juvenile delinquency cannot be blamed on any one single factor," the moderator said in revealing planned action for giving a city program in handling such problems through adequate recreational facilities, leadership from adults, adequate schools, and understanding counseling service.
A recent report on the extent of showed that almost 1000 boys and showed that almost 1000 boys and girls have been held in the local jails during the past four years.

Age Brackets
The survey shows that in the age bracket of 1 to 12, ten boys and four girls had been held; in ages 13 to 14, 82 boys and 24 girls had been in cells and in the 15 to 16 age group, 44 girls and 250 boys have been detained in the city's double-bunk room at city hall, an enclosure which was probably a cloakroom when the city hall was used as a school.

U S Demands Danube Share

BELGRADE — (P) — The United States demanded Thursday a full share for the Western Powers in control of Danube River shipping. She accused Russia of trying to impose a monopoly by the Communist states of eastern Europe.

U.S. Ambassador Cavendish Cannon placed before the 11-nation Danube conference the American plan for the river. But first he denounced a Russian proposal, introduced previously, as giving Russia and all her neighbors "special privileges" in Europe's most important waterway.

11 Nations
The American plan would provide for a Danube commission of 11 nations: Austria, Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Romania, the Ukraine, Russia, Yugoslavia, France, the United States and Britain. Under the Soviet plan, the membership would be limited to the Danube countries, excluding Austria until a peace treaty is signed.

The American proposal would give Germany a seat when that country gets a peace treaty "or before that time" if agreement can be reached by other members of the commission.

French Welcome
Adrien Thierry, chief French delegate, said he was glad the U.S. offered a plan. He defended in a speech the 1921 Danube convention of Paris, which the Russians are trying to void. He insisted the undertaking still holds and that French rights must be protected.

Ambassador Cannon told the conference the Russian proposal for future control of the river "is inadequate to assure that freedom of navigation to which all of us are committed."

Home-Made Cannon Fatal to Builder

SAN BERNARDINO, Calif. — (P) — Mrs. Roland M. Vallet told police that for six months her husband had been working in their garage on something. She said he refused to tell her what it was except that it was "important."
Vallet, 61, was killed by a home-made cannon, the "something" he had been working on for so long. Police said he left a note complaining of ill health.
