Harvest Hands Needed in Lane

Joe Grannan, local employment service representative in charge of farm labor, said Friday that about 75 more bean pickers are needed for work that will remain steady through early September.

Pay in the bean fields has been set locally at 2 1/2 cents a pound with a one quarter cent bonus for pickers who stay with the same grower through the season. Grannan said he had about 10 tents or cabins available for family groups, near the fields.

He said that hop picking will start, probably next week, with pay set at four cents a pound. Pickers are being registered now, and are being directed to the growers, Grannan reported.

Too Late to Volunteer After Draft Notice Served

WASHINGTON—(AP)—It's too late to volunteer for military service after a draft notice has been delivered.

That's one of four peacetime draft rules announced by Secretary of Defense Forrestal. The others:

1. Registrants who pass a pre-induction physical examination will be called no sooner than three weeks from that date—so they can settle personal affairs—and within 120 days—to make sure that the examination still holds good. If 120 days passes without call, they get another examination.
2. Those physicals will be given under current Army regulations, with assignment to duty according to physical ability. A general classification test will determine mental capacity. Minimum score: 70.
3. Wherever possible, the inductee will be given a chance to name the branch of service he wants.

Farmers Lose Count in Aluminum Battle

PORTLAND—(AP)—The six Oregon and Washington farmers who contend the Reynolds Metals Co. plants at Troutdale and Longview are hurting their farms lost a court round Thursday.

Federal Judge James A. Fee ruled that the aluminum company could take depositions from as many of the original plaintiffs as it wishes. Ninety-one of the 97 who first brought suit have since dropped it, and the remaining plaintiffs did not want their testimony to be admitted.

The farmers contend fumes from the plants injure their cattle.
