Bonds will be issued to all persons who have made individual contributions toward the hospital in the past.

Lodges, clubs, unions, corporations or other such organizations may make donations, as has been done in the past, and will receive a certificate, which will not be redeemable in anyway.

Members of the Fund Raising committee plan an immediate canvass of all merchants and business houses in the area to receive

donations.
