## Railroads Place Grain Embargo

PORTLAND, Ore.—(UP)—The movement of a record Pacific Northwest wheat harvest to port was stopped by the railroads Tuesday.

Orders Monday froze boxcar shipments en route to Portland, Ore., Longview, Vancouver, Tacoma and Seattle in Washington. The Association of American Railroads said the embargo would free cars that would only pile up on sidings already jammed with cars waiting to unload.

Grainmen in the ports were filled with wheat for export under the government foreign aid program. Rail officials said boxcars were being tied up with the overflow.

Grain men said the embargo would only increase the pressure on country elevators, many of which are filled to capacity and at six elevators wheat has been dumped on open ground for storage.

Clyde Kiddle, Portland regional director of the Commodity Credit Corp., government grain-buying agency said five ships were awaiting at Northwest ports this week to load wheat, possibly relieving a bulge in accumulated storage.

## Red Dean Refused Admission to U S

LONDON—(AP)—Dr. Hewlett Johnson, the Dean of Canterbury, said Monday he had been refused a visa to enter the United States for lecture engagements.

Dr. Johnson, for years a defender of the Soviet way of life and known as "The Red Dean," issued his statement through the London Daily Worker. He is a member of the editorial board of that Communist newspaper.

Dr. Johnson said the visa was refused because the embassy disapproved of the American-Soviet Friendship Society which was sponsoring his tour and an address at New York's Madison Square Garden Nov. 3.

In Washington, Press Officer Michael McDermott said the State

Department has no objections personally to Dr. Johnson. But he added, "It would regard a visit under auspices of this organization as not in our national interest."
