Monroe's Own Public Library Maintained by Civic Volunteers

MONROE—An interesting report on the Monroe Public Library is given at this time by its founder, and present librarian, Mrs. Louise McFarland of this community.

Since establishing the library in 1937, Mrs. McFarland has always been actively interested and engaged in its upkeep and growth. She took over as head librarian this past winter when the former head, Mrs. Helen Baker, resigned to become superintendent of Benton County schools.

The library has just completed its 11th year of service. The last report shows a total of 1,270 books on hand, 204 juvenile and 1,066 adult, fiction and non fiction. Circulation averages 173 monthly.

In the last ten years the growth of the library has been slow due to the fact that there is no revenue other than the fines collected on overdue books and an annual tea given to raise funds for the purchase of new books.

The American Legion Auxiliary subscribes to a Book of the Month Club for the library, and there are occasional gifts of books from generous and interested patrons.

Twelve monthly magazines are donated, and there is always an advance variety of pamphlets from business houses, colleges, universities, etc.

There is a wealth of reading matter available that people would be glad to see did they know just what was there; anything that is desired and not in the library can be procured by the librarian from the State Library, Salem.

Many newcomers in Monroe are not acquainted with this free public service.

The Monroe Library is located in the City Hall and is open on Wednesday and Saturday from 2 to 5 p.m.

During the summer months, Mrs. Helen Baker, Mrs. Helen Hought, Mrs. S. W. Bradley, and others of the American Legion Auxiliary are on duty and are glad to be of assistance at any time.

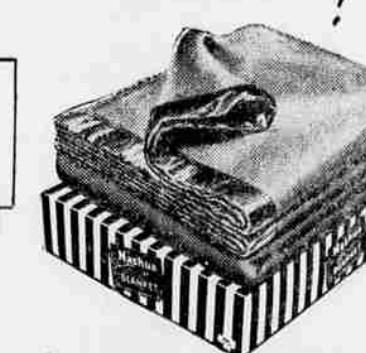

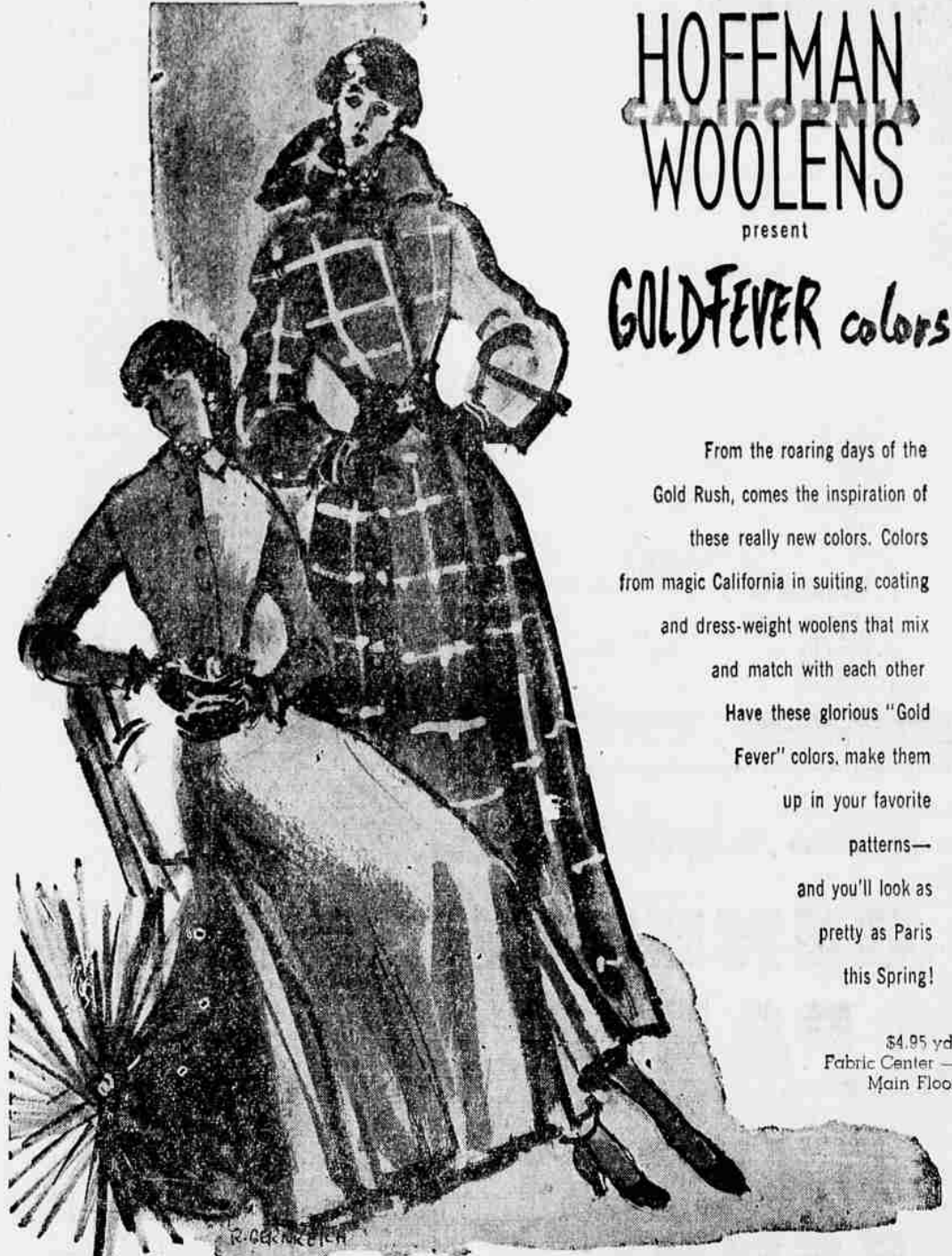
