

Gen. Hodge Warns Korean Leaders

Gen. Hodge, in a farewell message to the Korean people Wednesday, charged that Korean communists and fellow travelers are trying to sell your nation into the slavery of foreign dictators.

The commanding general of U.S. occupation forces in South Korea said that in the course of his three years in Korea he has come to admire and respect the Korean people. He asked that Korean leaders "drop all selfish personal ambitions and work solely for the welfare of the entire Korean nation."

Gen. Hodge was established as the general of the United States Army in 1871.

Vocational Classes Underway With Enlarged Shop Facilities

The Eugene Vocational School has started its classes with several enlarged shops.

The school, which is part of the Eugene school system, started Aug. 1 on its training program which operates 11 months a year. Students progress on an individual basis so entrance can be at any time.

Class Openings

There are still several openings in the following day classes: diesel, mill and cabinet carpentry, retail selling, aircraft and engines, radio, photography, electrical repair, creative design, dress design and machine shop.

Evening classes for homemakers, one-the-job apprentices and journeymen (employed workers) will start in the middle of September.

The following classes will be offered for on-the-job training and journeymen working in the trade who wish to improve themselves: plumbing, machine shop, electricity, carpentry, painters, business training, auto mechanics, radio, photography, sheet metal and meat cutting.

Other trade classes will be given if there is sufficient interest. Tailoring, upholstery, dress-making, decorating, children's clothing, foods, blouse-making and others will be offered for the homemaker.

Those homemakers or employed workers interested in a class should call the school, phone 1928, and leave their name so when a class is organized they can be notified.

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Court Mulls Fate of Tojo

TOKYO—UPI—The judge representing India on the 11-nation military tribunal has recommended that Hideki Tojo and other alleged war criminals in the group be acquitted, reliable sources indicated Wednesday.

One tribunal source said Judge R. B. Pal used up 80 cases of paper preparing his dissenting opinion. Copies of the lengthy document were also flown to India recently.

The paper's contents are being kept in the strictest secrecy and extraordinary military police precautions are being taken to prevent any leakage.

It was reported that during the long trial Pal, with one or two other tribunal members, took a lenient view toward the defendants, apparently holding it illogical to pin the responsibility alone on Tojo and his 24 co-defendants.

Wallace Wants Draft Held Up

LOUISVILLE, Ky., (AP)—Henry A. Wallace, Progressive Party candidate for president, believes President Truman should "hold off the draft" until he (Mr. Truman) confers with Premier Josef Stalin and settles "all outstanding questions" between Russia and the U.S.

Wallace said in a speech here Tuesday night that the U.S. was at fault for the Berlin crisis. He charged that President Truman had rejected a bid for Stalin for a peace parley.

"In a letter to Stalin," Wallace said, "I suggested a conference to solve all outstanding questions between our nations. That invitation was accepted by the Soviet Union, but rejected by Harry S. Truman."

Wallace again called upon the President "to immediately take steps toward a great conference to settle every outstanding issue between our nation and the Soviet Union."

"I call upon him to publicly announce that until such a conference is held he will not undertake to proclaim the draft," Wallace said.

Wallace said the president "had the power to hold off the draft" and predicted his party and the churches of the country "can force him to cancel it all together."
