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Lt. Colver Waller

Private graveside services for Lt. Colver K. Waller, son of Dr. and Mrs. Orville Waller, Eugene, were held Thursday at 11 a.m. at Rest Haven Memorial Park. Only immediate members of the family attended. Lt. Waller was killed in Italy Jan. 27, 1944 when his bomber squadron was supporting the Anzio beach-head.

Lt. Waller was born in Eugene Feb. 25, 1921. He attended Eugene public schools, and was graduated from University High School. He attended the University of Oregon one year, where he was a member of Kappa Sigma fraternity. In September, 1940, as a member of the Oregon National Guard, he was called into active Army service, serving in the medical department of the 41st Division. He transferred to the Army Air Corps in February, 1942 and received his bombardier's wings and commission at the Deming, N. M., air base May 8, 1943.

Soon after his transfer overseas into the 12th Air Force Lt. Waller was killed by German anti-aircraft during his fifth bombing mission.

A memorial service was held for Lt. Waller at the Central Presbyterian Church in January, 1945. Besides his parents he is survived by a brother and sister, Frederick and Sally Waller.

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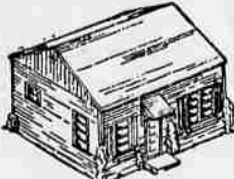
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
