

Lane Girls Fair Delegates

In areas where roads are available, the smaller operations can bid for timber and log in small units. If roads are not built by federal appropriations, the forest service generally has to sell large logging units to companies that are able to build their own roads.

Wherever possible, in order to encourage competition, the forest service seeks to offer for sale timber that can be reached by federal roads.

The party visited the Anderson box factory which uses bolts cut from salvage timber in logged over areas.

Sen. Morse told Anderson that that best way he could express his impression of the operation was "lumber industry statesmanship."

Box Manufacture

Anderson's operations employ some 200 people, mostly residents of the Fall Creek area, in the manufacture of wooden boxes from what had formerly been logging waste. He also operates a gang-mill which uses second growth logs culled in an experimental thinning operation designed to improve the quality of an advanced stand of second growth.

Both operations are converting forest waste into marketable products, and are making money both for Anderson and his employees, and for the public, in revenue to the forest service.

State Official Cars Will Be Painted White

SALEM—(AP)—All State Department automobiles will be painted white, Secretary of State Earl T. Newberry said Thursday.

Bean Harvest

Speeds Up Again

After a temporary cool weather lull in the Lane County bean harvest, the present warm trend is again speeding up picking in local fields. A call for more bean pickers was issued Friday by the Oregon State Employment Service.

More than fifty more hands are needed; information may be gained from Joe Grannan at the OSES or new workers may report, ready to go, to the truck station at Irish & Swartz No. 2, Tenth and Charnelton Sts., at 6:45 a.m.

Registration is also being accepted for hop picking with some hands needed now.

Rates for hop picking are four cents per pound and for beans, two and one-half cents with a one-quarter cent bonus per pound.

Central Lutheran

Has \$74,000 Permit

Central Lutheran Church of Eugene had a \$74,000 city building permit Friday for construction of their parish hall and educational unit at 1825 Potter St.

Ground-breaking ceremonies for the structure were held by the congregation last Sunday. Almost completed at the same site is the parsonage, which Pastor Harold Aalbu and his family will occupy in about a month.

The modern parish hall and educational unit will be in an L shape, but eventually the addition of the actual church structure will make it a U shape. Because the church sanctuary itself will not be built immediately, the parish hall-educational unit now underway will be used for worship.

Architect Pietro Belluschi of Portland designed the buildings, while Albert Vik of Springfield is the builder.

State police have been asked to locate a George Michael Cooley, 43, who may be working in the bean fields in this area. He is described as 5 feet seven inches tall, 135 pounds, slender, black hair, brown eyes, high forehead and bald on crown of head.
