Big Flying Boat Sets New Mark

CHICAGO — (AP)—The Navy's mammoth Caroline Mars landed in Lake Michigan off Chicago's Burnham Park at 11:25 a.m. (C.S.T.) Saturday, ending a flight that set a distance record for flying boats.

The 82½ ton giant made the non-stop trip from Honolulu to Ann Arbor, Mich., to Chicago in an official time of 24 hours and 12 minutes.

The unofficial mileage was 4876 miles for craft of its type.

The Mars, the largest flying boat in regular operation, took off from Honolulu at 11:13 a.m. (C.S.T.) Friday. It roared east to Ann Arbor, then circled and

ipped back to Chicago, its destination. The tremendous craft—it has a length of 120 feet and a wingspread of 200 feet—varried 39 persons and a cargo of agricultural products and leis from the Hawaiian Islands.

The previous flying boat record was 4375 miles from the Patuxent Naval Air Station in Maryland to Natal, Brazil.

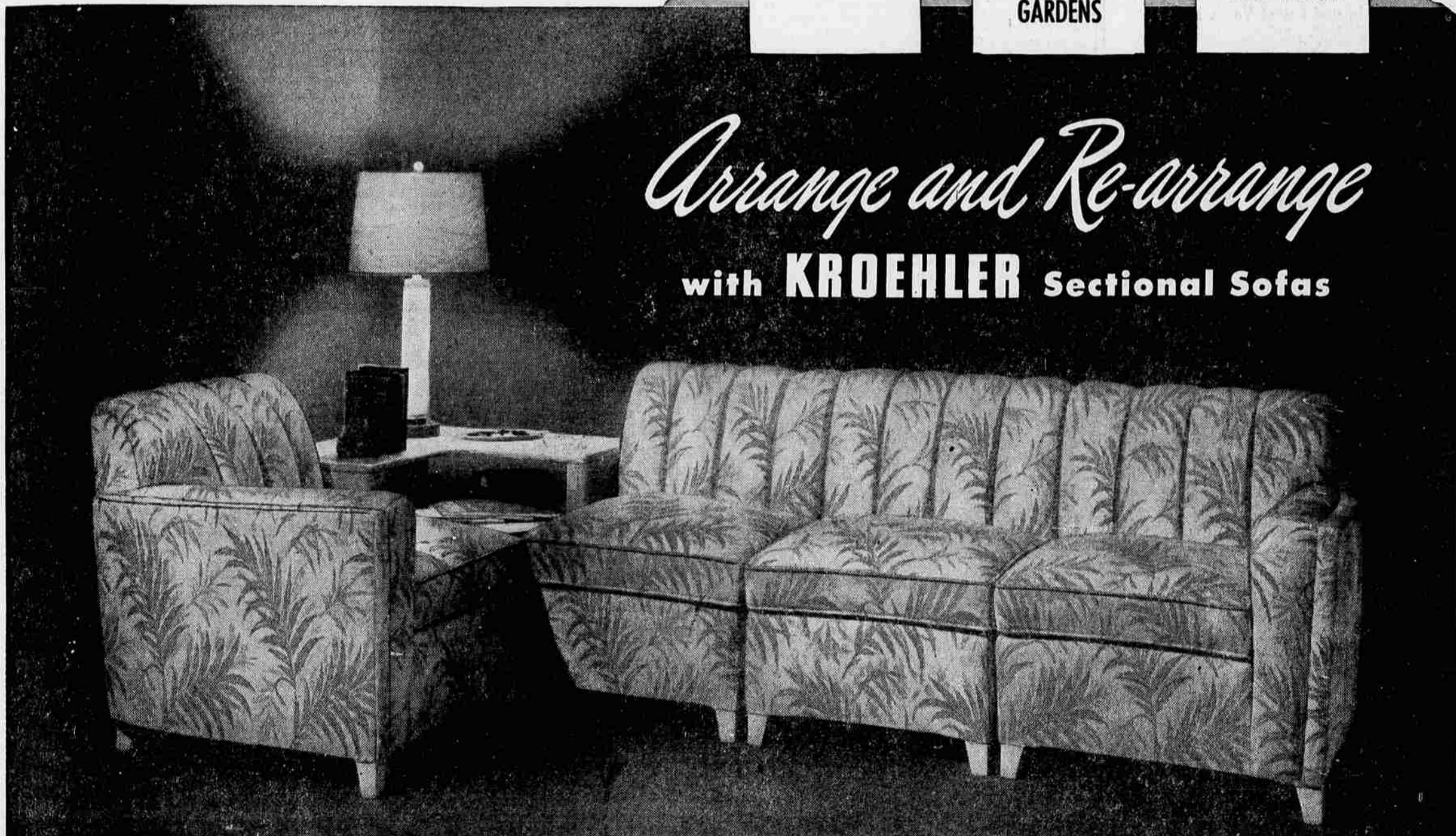

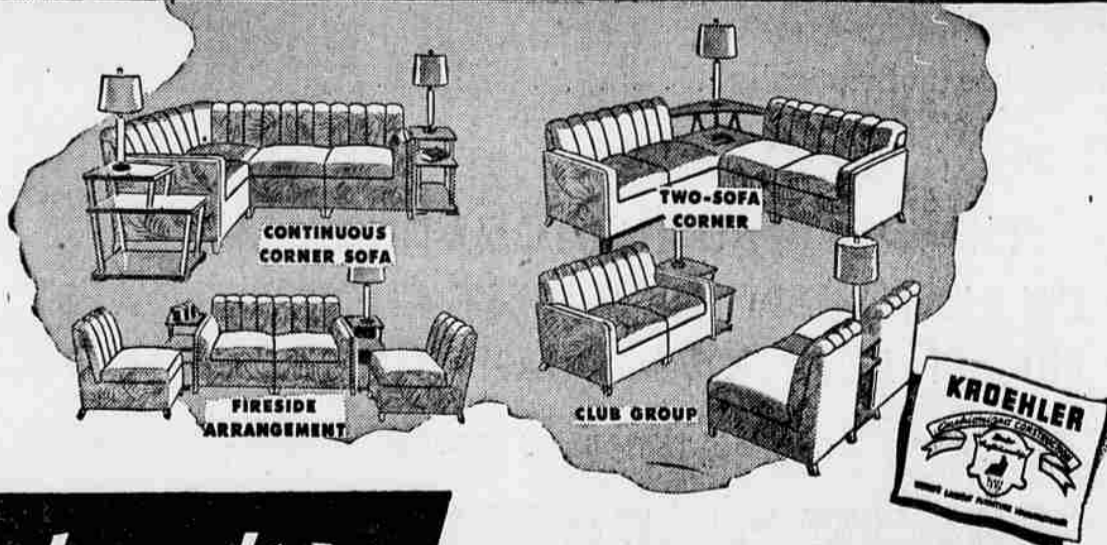
