Picker Supply Still Not High

Siphoning of non-resident harvest hands into other Northwest areas is beginning to pull down picker totals in Lane County bean fields and is renewing the month-old manpower shortage threat.

The appeal for aid is directly to residents and their families who are asked to turn out to help in the delayed harvest peak this week, according to Joe Grannan of the Oregon State Employment Service.

Calling for all the help "we can get for one more week," Grannan reminded local volunteers the pay is higher here than in other Willamette Valley fields.

Some hands are earning as high as \$12 per day on a base of two and a half cents per pound with a one-quarter cent bonus.

No experience is needed, "just old clothes," he says, and transportation is provided from Irish and Swartz No. 2 at Tenth and Charnelton Sts. daily at 6:45 a. m.

Registration is going ahead now in the employment office for hop pickers with pay rates at four cents a pound.
