

Mail Parcel Post Service Begins Today
ATTLE—(UP)—The beginning of domestic air mail parcel service was scheduled for 1, according to Robert Eng-traffic and sales manager West Coast Airlines. Eng-land said here that the new ce, with rates varying from 55 to 80 cents for the first pound, and with weight limits from eight ounces to 70 pounds, is expected to prove valuable to the North-west.
England said a survey by his company indicates that air ship-ments may increase as much as 100 per cent during the first year of the air parcel post service.

Italy's Colonies Still Unresolved

LONDON—(AP)—The problem of what to do about Italy's prewar colonies fell back into the lap of the Big Four foreign ministers Wednesday. Their deputies have wound up a year of work on the question without reaching agreement.
The Big Four now have until Sept. 15 to settle the future of Libya, Eritrea and Somaliland. If they can't agree, the United Nations Assembly will inherit the problem. The assembly meets in Paris Sept. 21.

Unofficially, the deputies were understood to have wound up in about this position: Russia urged return of the colonies to Italy under U.N. trusteeship control. Britain wanted Eritrea incorporated into Ethiopia and Libya split into three provinces—Tripolitania, the Fezzan and Cirenaica. The British wanted independence for Cirenaica after a period of British trusteeship. The French asked for the Fezzan and got British support. United States views were not made known.

Astronomers Discover Faint New Comet

FLAGSTAFF, Ariz. — (UP) — Astronomers have discovered a new comet, but you can't see it with less than a six-inch telescope.
Dr. Joseph Ashbrook of the Lowell Observatory near here said the comet is 100 times fainter than the faintest star visible to the naked eye. Ashbrook, visiting astronomer from Yale Observatory, New Haven, Conn., discovered the 11th-magnitude comet in the constellation Aquarius on photograph he took last Wednesday night.
The comet, seen late at night in the southern sky, is moving north a quarter degree daily, Ashbrook said.

Services Read For Justice Hughes

NEW YORK—(AP)—Funeral services were held Tuesday at Riverside Church for Charles Evans Hughes, former chief justice of the United States.
The Rev. Dr. Harry Emerson Fosdick, rector emeritus, conducted the services which consisted of the invocation, a prayer, a passage from the scriptures, a eulogy and a prayer.
"Justice Hughes was integrity personified," Fosdick told the congregation of distinguished mourners headed by Chief Justice Fred M. Vinson and Gov. Thomas E. Dewey of New York.

"We admired him but we loved him too. That combination of attitude and graciousness is what we the friends of Justice Charles Evans Hughes are thinking of today . . ."
Between 1500 and 2000 people attended the rites.

Eisenhower Stresses Need for Education

DENVER—(UP)—Gen. Dwight Eisenhower says the United States needs more education and a better sense of values.
The general, now president of Columbia University, told Denver alumni of the school that American youth was unconcerned about the "obvious truths" of democracy.
He proposed attention to religion, free enterprise and co-operation as a means of maintaining democracy.
Eisenhower announced that Columbia University intended to form a school for "national thinking" to teach citizenship for democratic living.

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Kindergarten Not in District

SPRINGFIELD — Superintendent of Schools E. H. Silke reminded parents Wednesday there is no kindergarten system in District 19. More than 30 calls concerning kindergarten have been taken in school offices the past few days.
"Facilities at present prevent us from setting up a kindergarten in any of our schools," Silke said.
