

U S Government Hits Two Unions

atomic energy facilities must be operated "in a matter best calculated to assure that those who participate in the program are loyal to the United States."

"This includes those," he said, "who, though themselves not employees of contractors, do exercise administrative, negotiating and

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disciplinary authority over such employees of contractors as are members of union bargaining units."

A Directive
Lillenthal noted in his letter to Wilson that G. E. felt it might jeopardize its relations with U. E. in other, non-atomic plants if it refused on its own authority to recognize the union at the New Knolls II atomic power laboratory being set up at Schenectady, N. Y.

Hence his letter was intended as a commission directive to the company.

Exemption Satisfactory
In his letter to Herzog announcing the end of the union recognition ban, Lillenthal said the exemption made in the case of Oak Ridge has proved satisfactory from a security standpoint. But he added:

"It may be that many new problems will arise at other commission installations where novel conditions and new unions may be involved."

The CIO United Chemical Workers and several AFL unions have been recognized at the Oak Ridge plants. All of them have complied with the non-Communist provision of the Taft-Hartley Law.

tempted transmission of defense information to a foreign government.

Thomas' letter to President Truman was equally bitter. He said that evidence of Communist espionage had been placed before the President more than three years ago. He said he would not be "deterred or intimidated" by personal attacks upon him by the President or the attorney general.

Among the "ridiculous accusations" made, he said, were that the committee had made confidential information available to foreign intelligence services and had injured the reputation of innocent men.

Mitchum Enters Not Guilty Plea

LOS ANGELES — (AP)— Handsome Robert Mitchum and two of his co-defendants pleaded innocent Wednesday to narcotics charges after his attorney failed in an attempt to have the indictment dismissed on a legal technicality.

Jerry Giesler, noted criminal lawyer representing Mitchum, asked dismissal with the argument that a portion of the indictment is not in the English language and is therefore unconstitutional.

He referred to the section which charged the defendants with possession and conspiracy to possess "flowering tops and leaves of Indiana hemp (cannabis sativa)."

Mitchum, 31, actress Lila Leeds, 20, dancer Vicki Evans, 25, and Robin Ford, 31, real estate man, are charged with possessing a drug weed popularly known as marijuana.

The four were arrested shortly after midnight last Sept. 1, at a secluded cottage in Laurel Canyon, north of Hollywood.

Miss Evans did not enter a plea, as her attorney asked for time to argue for dismissal on grounds that evidence against her is insufficient. This will be heard Oct. 7.

U S Prods Soviet On Lend-Lease

WASHINGTON — (AP)— The United States has prodded Russia to settle up its \$11,000,000,000 lend lease account, but with little success.

State Department officials disclosed Tuesday that a new note was sent to Moscow earlier this month urging new face-to-face negotiations for the overdue agreement. No reply has been received.

Percentage Asked
In trying to fix the amount of Russia's bill, the United States has requested payment based on a percentage of the cost of lend-lease goods which have peace-time value—such as tractors, trucks, machinery, locomotives and freight cars.

The Russians got a greater proportion of civilian-type lend-lease goods than other countries like Britain and France which already have settled their accounts.

War Supplies
No payment is being asked for the thousands of planes, guns, tanks, and great quantities of explosives shipped to Russia to arm its troops fighting the Nazis on the eastern front.

Moscow's failure to return merchant and naval ships given her under lend-lease has been sharply criticized in this country.

Russia still has 87 American liberty ships, 28 frigates, three ice breakers and some smaller naval vessels.

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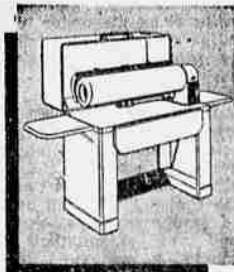


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Mother, Son Believed Killed

EDMONTON, Alta., — (AP)— R. C. A. F. headquarters announced two Dakota aircraft, part of a seven-plane air search, Wednesday sighted a missing light plane in which a mother and her son were flying from Watson Lake, Y. T., to Fort Nelson, B. C.

A spokesman at headquarters said the two ships simultaneously reported finding the maroon Stinson aircraft lying on its back in dead brush about 45 miles from its destination.

A report from Fort Nelson said the light plane was only a few hundred yards from the Alaska Highway which Mrs. A. L. Linter of Anchorage, Alaska, had been following to Fort Nelson. A two-man para rescue unit which was standing by in Fort Nelson left immediately with a ground party for the crash scene.

Mrs. Linter was believed to be flying her son to school, in the United States when the aircraft was reported overdue at Fort Nelson Monday.

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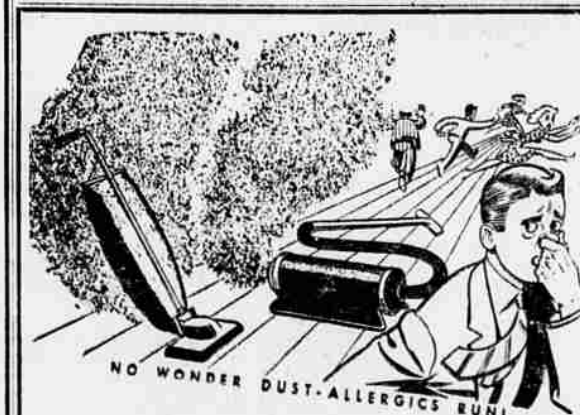
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
