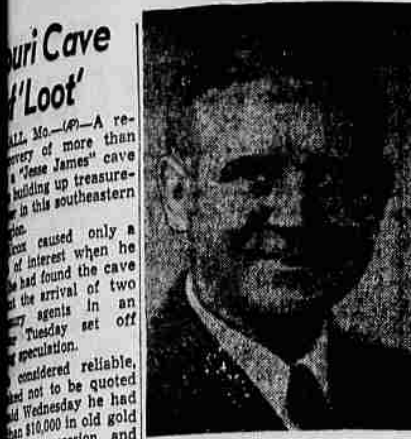




Dr. Kirby Page To Speak Here

Dr. Kirby Page, author, lecturer and social evangelist arrives in Eugene Wednesday to head a conference on World Affairs at the First Methodist Church.

Dr. Page will speak Wednesday night at the joint Family Night of the First Christian Church and the First Methodist Church at 8:15 following a pot-luck dinner. His subject will be "Can Military Weapons Defend Us?"

At 8 p.m. Dr. Page will speak on "What Does God Want Us to Do About Russia?" This meeting in the church auditorium is open to the public, and a forum discussion will follow Dr. Page's talk.

This meeting will be the fourth in a series of joint meetings of Christian and Methodist Churches to study peace plans and problems. Under the auspices of the Methodist Women's Society of Christian Service, a study has been made of the United Nations Organization and of such plans as the Quota Force Plan, Culbertson's plan and Federal Union.

Dr. Page is the author of 24 volumes and 19 pamphlets on international, social, economic, religious and devotional subjects. His works have been translated into 10 languages, and more than a million copies have been sold. He has spoken in more than 400 colleges and universities as well as in 1000 churches of many denominations. Dr. Page has visited 35 countries, and is speaking in Oregon under the auspices of the American Friends Service Committee, in the peace education program of that committee.

HEY NEIGHBOR!
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Short Range Planes Fly Hippy-Hop Across Pacific

HONOLULU — (AP) — The Navy sent 12 short range combat planes 2426 miles across the Pacific Tuesday to prove a point.

The point: To deliver such aircraft over ocean distances beyond fuel capacity by the shortest, quickest route, let them fly—with refueling stops aboard conveniently spaced carriers.

That's what the 12 fighters and dive-torpedo bombers did—and for the first time. They hippy-hopped from Moffett Field, Calif., near San Francisco, to Barbers Point, Hawaii, landing on two carriers in between. The elapsed time: 11 hours, 53 minutes.

Rear Admiral J. M. Hoskins, chief of staff to the commander of air, Pacific, reminded newsmen after the landings that the planes were "combat ready" for action when they arrived.

"In time of war, needed aircraft could be ferried in this manner over vast ocean areas," he said.

Now the Navy is planning a similar test hop with jet fighters.

The carrier Princeton refueled the 12 planes 800 miles from the California coast and the Tarawa did the job 1600 miles out. The single engine planes, taking off from Moffett Field at dawn,

Sun's Forces Demonstrated

ITHACA, N.Y. — (AP) — The tremendous forces which exist in the sun—thousands of times more fantastic than an atomic explosion—were demonstrated here Tuesday night at a gathering of radio-astronomers.

Motion pictures of the sun, taken through special telescopic equipment, revealed a series of

mighty explosions dwarfing the blast of an atom bomb.

One of the explosions shot up a column estimated to be 20,000 miles high which mushroomed out into a head five times bigger than the earth. Another eruption took the form of a perfect wreath of fire that rose from the sun's edge and swelled until it was nearly 1,000,000 miles across.

Scientists believe these phenomena may be the "tubes" which generate the sun's radio signals, whose source they are trying to determine.
