Post Named For Local Boy

A former German Army barracks, five miles south of Heidelberg near the town of Schwetzingen, and now occupied by the United States Army, has been renamed in honor of Pfc. George S. Tompkins, Jr., son of Mrs. Lora Tompkins in the 2100 block on Cleveland St., who died in action April 8, 1945.

Tompkins, who was in the 397th Regiment, 100th Infantry Division, was mortally wounded near Heilbronn, Germany, and was posthumously awarded a Silver Star medal for gallantry in action.

Grade School Pupils To Hear New Rules

As Fire Prevention draws to its Saturday climax of a bike parade, Friday stresses new fire regulations, planned by the National Board of Fire Underwriters, and approved recently by the Eugene city council.

Friday, "Fire Regulation Day," will see new regulations explained to grade school students. The regulations approved Sept. 27 will take effect Oct. 27 and cover the handling and storage of inflammable liquids with restrictions on garages, dry cleaning establishments, tire re-building plants, theaters, wood working plants and lumber yards, bowling alleys, tents, carnivals and circuses, explosives, dangerous chemicals and fire exits and equipment.

The ordinances have been brought up to date from the 1943 book of regulations, and newly included regulations are the ones covering the bowling alleys and circus equipment.

U Library Print Collection Available to Art Enthusiasts

Among the most popular services offered by the university library is the print collection of famous paintings. With addition of 50 prints this year, art enthusiasts may borrow from the collection of over 700 reproductions of the masters.

The collection was started at the University by Mrs. Marion F. McClain in 1928 when she sent to the Alinari brothers, Vatican City, Italy for reproductions. Mrs. McClain's first purchases were four copies of the Sistine chapel series by Michelangelo for which she paid \$5.50.

At the time the prints were offered to the students for a 10 cent rental fee for each month the prints were out. With the money collected from rentals, new prints were added to the collection. Finally the fees were dropped entirely and now the copies are available to the public without charge.

Bernice M. Rise, reader's consultant and circulation librarian, who has charge of the collection, has added to the prints each year. Modern painters such as Cezanne, Manet, Picasso and Renoir are very popular with the students, according to Miss Rise. Landscape prints are more popular than portraits. Along with the prints are offered biographies of the painters, books of criticism, and other explanatory material.

Graduate Enrollment Pushes Up U Total

Final registration figures, released by UO Registrar Clifford Constance, show a new high of 6125 students and an overall registration increase of four per cent.

The chief reason for the unprecedented increase has been an influx of graduate students. A 28 per cent boost in this school alone accounts for nearly half of the total registration increase. Graduate students now number 501 over last year's 398.

Veterans continue to account for a considerable portion of the student population. Forty-six per cent of the students served in the armed forces. Of the 2877 veterans registered, 2798 are men and 89 are women. Veteran enrollment for fall term, 1947, was 3108.

A seminar class also will be offered, instructed by Dr. Ruth Hopson, assistant professor of general science in the State System of Higher Education's general extension division. The seminar is scheduled to start Oct. 12 at 7 p.m. in 204 Chapman Hall on the University of Oregon campus.

Friday the teachers heard Dr. Kenneth Gordon, professor of zoology at Oregon State College, deliver an illustrated lecture. About 200 teachers attended.
