Tiders, Lions Face Final 3-C Opponents Friday Uni-High Win Can Mean Title Cleveland Gives Team Welcome

Four Tri-County league tilts and one inter-divisional game are on the prep docket for this weekend.

Cottage Grove and University High, tied for the Southern Division leadership, play their final league opponents. Both are heavily favored to roll up victories. If the final games go as planned, University High will play the Northern Division winners for the league championship, as the Tiders edged the Grovers in first downs and yardage when the two played to a 7-10 tie last Friday.

Cottage Grove plays at Elmira Friday afternoon, while University High travels to Junction City for an afternoon tussle with the Tigers.

Saints to Newport

In the Northern Division, Lebanon and Sweet Home, both undefeated, meet in a game that could eventually decide the Northern championship. Lebanon is on top at present, having two league verdicts to one for Sweet Home.

Last week, Lebanon rolled by Toledo, 33-0, with Don Hebert and Jack Evans leading the way. Sweet Home, in the meantime, took care of Taft, 20-0.

St. Mary's of the southern sector travels to Newport for the inter-divisional contest. The Saints rested last week, while Newport knocked over Tillamook, 7 to 0.

Kenny Warren scored the University High touchdown Friday to give him a total of 30 points in three games and the Southern Division scoring leadership. Jim Weir of Cottage Grove is still second with 19, followed by Marvin Schaffer and Bob Summers, both of Grove, with 18 and 15, respectively. Jim McKay of Junction is in fifth place with 14.

Hebert and Evans rank one-two in the Northern sector. Hebert has 25 points in two games, while Evans picked up 19 last week for second spot.

Ted Anderson of Newport has 18, Tex Stevenson of Sweet Home 12, and Jess Fogarty, Newport, eight to round out the "big five."

CLEVELAND, Oct. 13 — (AP) — Tooting horns, screaming sirens, and raining confetti piped the Cleveland Indians back home Tuesday with their first World Series championship since 1920.

The goodburgers of Cleveland had waited 28 years to hoist it up for a victorious baseball team, and they did themselves proud with a tumultuous welcome parade watched by more than 200,000 persons.

Some 15,000 were at the railroad station when the Indians pulled in at 8:30 a. m. EST aboard a special train from Boston where the World Series victory was completed Monday.

The team climbed into 10 open cars and paraded five miles down Euclid Avenue in the wake of a police motorcycle escort and a blaring brass band.

This was the third whoop-de-doo for the Indians in eight days. First it was the American League

Northwestern Center Is 'Lineman of Week'

NEW YORK, Oct. 13 — (AP) — Alex Sarkisian, captain and center of Northwestern's undefeated team, was named the collegiate football lineman of the week Wednesday in the Associated Press' first poll of the season.

Sarkisian, a 215-pound senior, played the full 60 minutes against Minnesota. His work in stopping up the middle of the Northwestern forward wall played a major role in N. W.'s 19-16 victory over the Gophers.

The Northwestern captain was one of 29 linemen—usually the forgotten players on Saturday—from all parts of the country who drew high praise for their efforts up front.

Alf Hemstad, of the University of Washington, and Paul Burris, of Oklahoma, topped the guards. Hemstad, a 24-year-old married senior and veteran of 64 missions in the Army Air Corps during the war, made several spectacular tackles as the Huskies best UCLA. Burris' play helped the Sooners whip Texas.
