

Neighbors Come Across For Two War Cripples

LOCKPORT, N. Y. — (U.P.) — Bruno S. Scalzo and Joseph G. Groff, both severely wounded World War II veterans, know the meaning of the words "neighbors." Their neighbors and fellow townsmen have undertaken to build the war heroes specially equipped homes.

Scalzo, who was paralyzed from the waist down when a Nazi sniper bullet lodged in his spine during the fighting at the battle of the

Bulge in Belgium in 1945, and Groff, who likewise had a piece of shrapnel embedded in his spine while fighting in Germany, will be next door neighbors.

Scores of local citizens volunteered their services to aid the drive. Some donated time and labor, others gave money, still others dug down for both. The two houses when completed will have a combined value of \$48,000.

Three Religious Viewpoints Featured in Campus 'Week'

Viewpoints of the three great faiths are being presented to University of Oregon students and townspeople this week on the university campus. The program of speeches, firesides and devotional services, which makes up Religious Evaluation Week, was launched Sunday night in a semi-theatrical production featuring the Eugene Gleemen and the Wesley players, and will continue through Thursday.

Morning worship, a new phase of the week, is held every morning except Friday in Alumni Hall, Gerlinger from 7:15 to 7:45. The Rev. Dudley Strain, First Christian Church, Salem, will conduct services Wednesday morning, and Dr. J. Renwick McCullough, First Presbyterian Church, Tacoma, Thursday morning.

Daily Forums
Rev. John R. Schroeder, a former Navy chaplain now director of Christian activities at Linfield College will speak daily at the noon forums in John Straub Hall. Wednesday's topic will be "Christianity and Her Rival Cults in America," and Thursday "The Case of the Elusive God."

The 3 o'clock forums in Gerlinger hall feature "The Answer of the Churches." Monday the views of a world church were given, and Tuesday, the Protestant viewpoint.

Catholic Answer
The Catholic answer will be given Wednesday, and Thursday, the Jewish reply.

The four o'clock forum is divided into three sections, the first conducted by Dr. Harlan Hogue, professor of religion, Scripps College, Claremont, Cal. Dr. Hogue's topics for Wednesday and Thursday will be "The Meaning of God in Human Experience"; "When Conduct is Religious"; and "Architects of a Tremendous Future."

Dr. Carl Henry, professor of theology and philosophy, Fuller Theological Seminary, Pasadena,

Cal., will present the Christian viewpoint on "Nature" and "God" Wednesday and Thursday.

Other 4 o'clock forum topics will be: Wednesday, "The Dilemma of a Good God and a Suffering World," by the Rev. John R. Schroeder; and Thursday, "Far Eastern Crisis," Dr. Frank G. Williston, University of Washington, a lecturer and writer on the Far East.

All these events are open to townspeople. The Religious Evaluation Week speakers will also visit classes and living organizations.

Music Recital At U Thursday

Wade Parks, instructor in piano at the University of Oregon school of music, who will appear in recital on the campus Thursday, has also been booked for a concert in Portland under the sponsorship of the Portland Art Museum. He is also scheduled for a recital in Fresno, Cal., later in the season. His Eugene appearance will

mark the opening of the University music school concert season. Program for the recital, to be at 8:15 p.m. in the music auditorium, will include "Two Organ Choral Preludes" by Bach-Busoni; Beethoven's "Andante Favori"; "Carnival, Opus 9" by Schumann; Ravel's impressionistic "Sonatine." The recital will be concluded with "Waltz." This is the first early professional Chicago Master studied for a number of years at the University of Oregon where he received a degree.

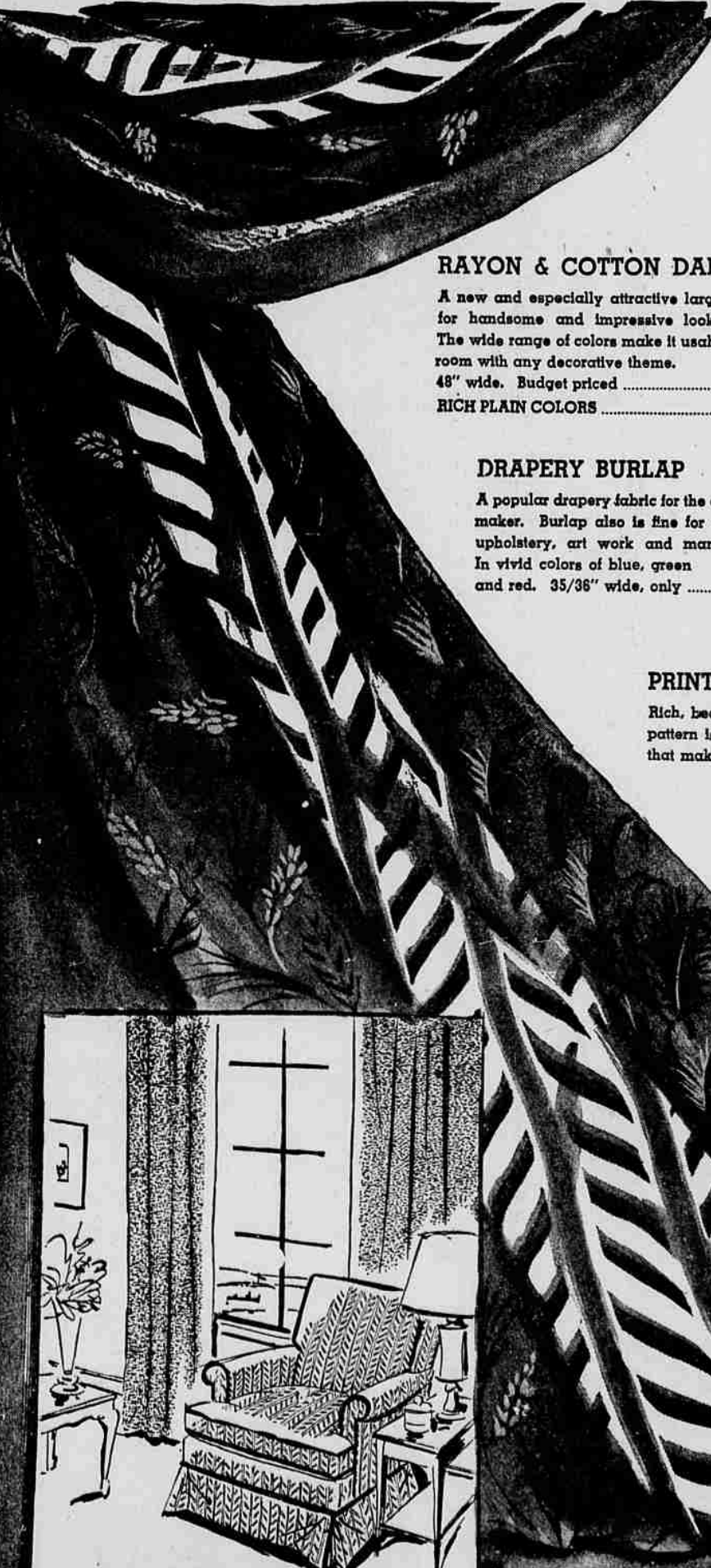
