

49 Cent Hamburger Hits Portland Markets

PORTLAND — (AP) — Hamburger at 49 cents a pound was back on the retail meat counters here Tuesday in the wake of wholesale price drops for beef.

One large chain said the 10-cent-a-pound retail drop stemmed

from the \$1 a hundred decline at the market Monday after slight drops last week.

Veal steaks and loin chops were also down 14 cents a pound, but hogs regained \$1 of last week's \$5 a hundred drop. Lambs were off 50 cents Monday at the livestock market.

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Longshoremen Offer to Elect Group to Meet Employers

SAN FRANCISCO — (AP) — CIO longshoremen Tuesday countered the refusal of waterfront employers to meet with "irresponsible" union leadership by offering to elect a rank and file negotiating committee, empowered to sign a three-year contract.

The offer, in effect, challenged the strikebound West Coast shippers, who have demanded that maritime union leaders sign non-Communist affidavits as a condition for bargaining.

The employers' stand was directed especially at longshore

chief Harry Bridges and Hugh Bryson, head of the CIO Marine Cooks and Stewards.

The longshoremen asserted that the employers' demand was tantamount to "dictating the selection of the union's negotiators." They said that was completely "foreign" to collective bargaining and against the law, and would result in a company union.

Rank and File

The longshore union proposed that its members would elect a negotiating committee directly from rank and file longshoremen on the picket line. The election would be secret. In addition, the union proposed that any agreement reached by this committee and the employers would be submitted to the membership for a secret vote.

Then the union suggested that a contract be drawn up for three years, instead of the usual one-year term. This, the union said, would allow shippers an "opportunity to make long-term plans in the interest of their business and to assure a long period of stability on the waterfront."

Meanwhile, two top CIO officials sent here by CIO President Philip Murray sought some means of reopening the stalled negotiations. They were Allan Haywood, national director of organization, and R. J. Thomas, another CIO organizer.

Their presence on the West Coast prompted speculation that the CIO "right-wing" was attempting to enter the maritime strike, possibly to answer the demand of the employers for "responsible" union officials.

In Tacoma, AFL longshoremen voted to push through CIO pickets and handle all cargo on vessels anchored in that harbor. Local President George Miller said the CIO had no excuse for sending pickets there from Seattle.

Earlier Monday, AFL longshoremen escorted CIO pickets from the docks and worked cargo for about 45 minutes. There was no violence, but the CIO longshoremen said they were leaving "under protest."

You Can Go Up, But Can't Get Down

LOS ANGELES — (AP) — You can take a rocket flight to the moon, but it will have to be a one-way trip.

Hall L. Hibbard, Lockheed aircraft corporation chief engineer, told the American Society of Tool Engineers Monday that science has solved the problems of building a rocket that can travel into outer space.

"The trouble is that we can't figure out how anyone in the rocket would get back to earth," he said.

HUGE GENERATOR FINISHED

MOSCOW — (AP) — Tass said Tuesday a Leningrad factory has completed one of the largest hydroelectric generators in the world. The dispatch said 65 freight cars will be needed to transport the generator to the Dnepr dam for installation.

Drugs Hauled From Locker

PORTLAND — (AP) — Drugs valued at as much as \$20,000 were seized Monday night by city detectives and a federal agent from a union railroad station baggage locker.

Narcotics Agent John H. Young said a ship's cook, identified as Edward T. Nelson, 56, was arrested outside the station and had a key to the locker in his pocket. He is held without bail on a charge of illegal possession of the drugs.

Young said the drugs presumably were brought here from the Orient. Nelson had last worked on the steamship Canadian Mail and had been paid off when the vessel berthed Oct. 4 at Seattle. The small packages of cocaine, morphine and morphine atrophine

bore labels of a London drug firm. They were concealed in cigarette cartons in the satchel detectives pulled from the locker.

Detective Sgt. Myron A. Warren said the drugs represented the largest haul here in his memory.
