Modern Europe Pastor's Topic

Dr. Paul P. Pettigord, who has just returned from two World Conferences in Europe, will speak Wednesday at 7:30 p.m., at the Evangelical United Brethren Church, 8th and Monroe Sts., and will show colored slides he personally took of present-day Europe.

Dr. Pettigord, president of the Western School of Evangelical Religion, Portland, attended the Youth for Christ World Congress on Evangelism in Beatenberg, Switzerland; and represented the National Association of Evangelicals at a World Conference in Amsterdam. He will speak on "The Possible Modern Reformation" in which he will discuss modern religious trends observed through personal interviews in Milan, Rome and Naples, Italy. Dr. Pettigord will also give eyewitness accounts of the Gospel preached and received in Europe, of the "Red Menace" and threat to peace, of the need of European Youth, and will present an answer to the ills of Europe.

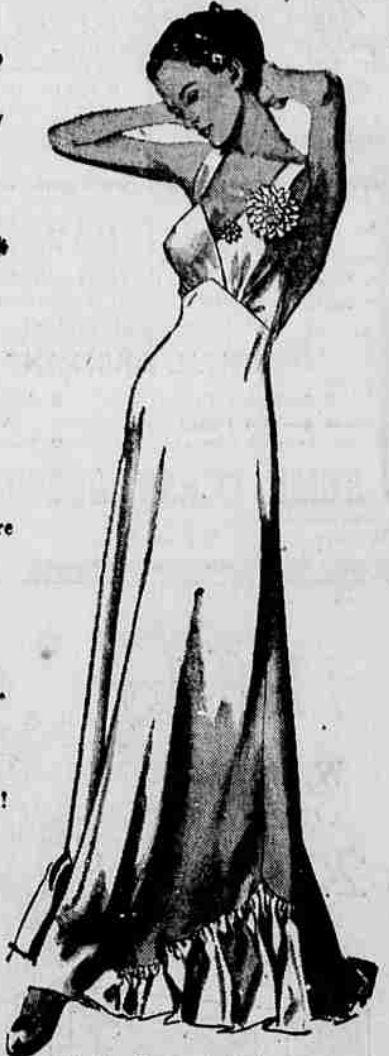
