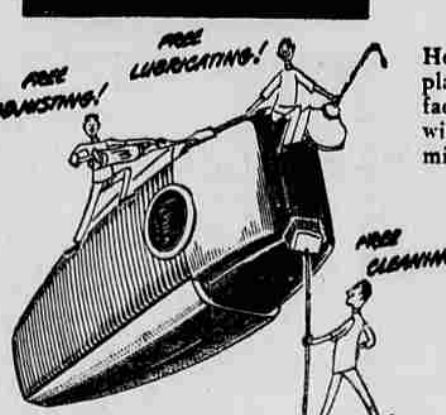

Albany Man Lives Through 12,000 Volts

ALBANY, Ore. — (U.P.) — Oren Newland of Brownsville walked into a 12,000-volt power line and survived.

The jolt was so severe it dazed and knocked the hat off another person several feet away.

Newland was looking for sheep on a farm field when he walked into the line, sagging low because of an unnoticed broken insulator. His hair was singed and his forehead seared.

The hat was knocked off Mrs. J. D. Hyde. When she recovered from the secondary shock, she slapped and rubbed Newland into partial recovery, then called an ambulance. Hospital attendants here said Newland was recovering.

Cabinet Invokes Death Penalty

PARIS—(U.P.)—The French government and political threats to its existence, decided Friday to invoke the death penalty against major food speculators.

Premier Henri Queuille headed an inner cabinet meeting Thursday night at which it was decided to apply the so-called farges law of October, 1946, in the battle against the black market.

The law, which takes its name from former food minister Yves Farge, provides the death penalty for speculators in basic food products such as meat, wine, milk and grains.

Minister of Justice Andre Marie said after the cabinet meeting that the government intended to sap the strength of the strike movement by making workers' pay stretch further.

Some 350,000 coal miners still were idle in the 12-day strike that has hampered French heavy industry on the eve of winter.

Reds Capture Chinsien City

NANKING — (U.P.) — The Chinese Defense Ministry announced late Friday that the Communists had captured Chinsien.

The city in southwestern Manchuria had been the key supply point for isolated Mukden, 125 miles to the northeast.

Shortly before the announcement of its fall after a prolonged Communist siege, reliable sources said Generalissimo Chiang Kai-Shek had flown to Peiping because of Chinsien's critical situation.

Four Youths Arrested

City police Thursday night arrested four 20-year-old youths for siphoning gas from a car parked on Seventeenth Ave. near Mill. Taken to police headquarters and charged with larceny from an automobile, the youths signed statements admitting parts in the gas stealing and were then taken to the county jail.

Escapee Caught

SALEM, Ore. — (U.P.) — State police said Friday that Kenneth J. Nelson, 36, was back in custody. He was recaptured in Waldport as he was walking along a street.

Nelson with Eugene Chandler, 28, overpowered a jailer and escaped from the Benton County jail in Corvallis Tuesday.

Police picked up Nelson's trail when his fingerprints were found in a Philomath store, burglarized Tuesday night, police said. Chandler was still at large.

Tax Savings Gain Over '47

With 1948 payrolls breaking all peace-time and wartime records, tax savings for covered employers this year will pass the eight-million-dollar mark, bringing the total for eight years of experience rating close to \$34 millions.

Wages reported paid by covered employers during the first half of 1948 have reached \$430,280,000, a gain of 11.3 percent over the same period in 1947.

Multnomah County has 48.2 percent of Oregon's covered pay rolls, while contributing 44.5 percent of the unemployment benefit funds, according to a tabulation of the 1947 figures just completed by the Oregon State Unemployment Commission.

Although seasonal variations in Oregon during the post-war period have not been so sharp as in the thirties, 45,303 more workers were reported in September than in February, 1947.

Fewer than 2 percent of Oregon's covered workers and only about 1 percent of the entire labor force drew unemployment checks during September. Both readjustment allowances to veterans and state payments to workers unable to find suitable jobs dropped to the lowest level since the end of the war despite continued immigration which has brought the state's labor force well over 650,000, the highest yet recorded.

Tobin Foresees Further Action

DES MOINES, Ia. — (U.P.) — Secretary of Labor Maurice Tobin said Friday that the International Typographical Union "is only the first union to feel the impact of the Taft-Hartley Law."

Tobin said the federal court ruling which convicted the ITU of contempt of court is "evidence of how harsh the Taft-Hartley Law is against labor."

He said he expects more court action against labor unions shortly.

"The National Assn. of Manufacturers has had the 'go slow' sign up until after the election," he said.

Warships in Greece

ATHENS, Greece — (U.P.) — Twelve U. S. warships arrived in Greek waters in the greatest single display of American naval might Greece has yet seen.

Vice Adm. Forrest P. Sherman, commander of the Sixth Task Fleet, and Rear Adm. J. J. Balentine, commander of Carrier Division One, headed the force. The aircraft carrier Franklin D. Roosevelt, four cruisers, five destroyers and two auxiliaries made up the fleet, most of which anchored in Piraeus Harbor.

WASHINGTON — (U.P.) — The House committee investigating questionable trade practices said Friday it is inquiring into alleged gray markets in the sales of automobiles and rayon yarns.

It reported Thursday that gray

marketeers in steel are reaping "fantastic profits." It estimated that 10 to 12 per cent of the nation's total sheet and strip steel production is being sold in gray markets.

The committee proposed a voluntary control program within the steel industry to curb such operations.

About \$400,000,000 worth of gold is produced each year.
