

Lane School Funds Received

Lane County has received \$131,660 out of state and county school funds distributed by the Oregon State Department among the 36 counties of the state.

The distribution is the first payment of the year, taken from surplus income tax money. The funds are allocated on the basis of \$10 per child between the ages of four and 20 in each county.

Identical payments will be paid to the counties next April 13. Payments to other counties included Benton, \$30,040, and Multnomah, \$476,200.
