Business Review Publishes Business Trend Analysis

Issue of Oregon Business Review, published by the Oregon Business Research Association, contains analysis of current business trends.

Heavy movement of business from the coast to the interior has been noted in the number of per-

sons seeking employment dropped to 23,400, the lowest level since the end of the war.

Employment prospects in some specific industries is listed as follows:

Construction—A steady increase of 10 per cent since May was followed by further gains during the summer and fall. It may be predicted that November employment will remain well above the July figure and that January will not show the usual seasonal decline.

Food Processing—September is the peak of employment in this industry. Last year's high of 30,000 may be exceeded if crops and prices are up to expectations.

Lumber and Logging—The immediate prospects in this industry are clouded by the maritime strike, which has caused some mills which ship largely by water to close down. Were it not for this unfavorable development, fall employment would be fully up to last year's record-breaking level.

Wholesale and Retail Trade—Jobbing and packing firms are on their way to a fall peak, but retail trade barely held its own during the summer months.

Recent action of the Student Affairs Committee in approving the formation of Phi Eta Sigma makes the University of Oregon the 58th institution to install a chapter of the national honorary scholarship fraternity for freshmen men.

Vergil S. Fogdall, director of men's affairs, said recognition of the honorary brings to the Oregon campus a "freshmen equivalent of

Phi Beta Kappa.

Nut Growers Get Suggestions

Northwest nut growers have been finding an excessive amount of moisture in their walnuts after picking which has resulted in the meat being badly shriveled. Growers have been wondering whether or not they should proceed with picking under such conditions.

John E. Trunk, general manager

of the Northwest Nut Growers Assn., has issued the following suggestions to walnut growers:

1. Pick from a large number of trees at least 100 pounds of walnuts. Be sure there are thoroughly representative on the production throughout the plantings.
2. Take these walnuts to a drier where careful records of the green weight should be made. The nuts should then be washed and thoroughly dried.
3. Remove the nuts from the drier; weigh them and check the percentage of moisture loss or shrinkage.

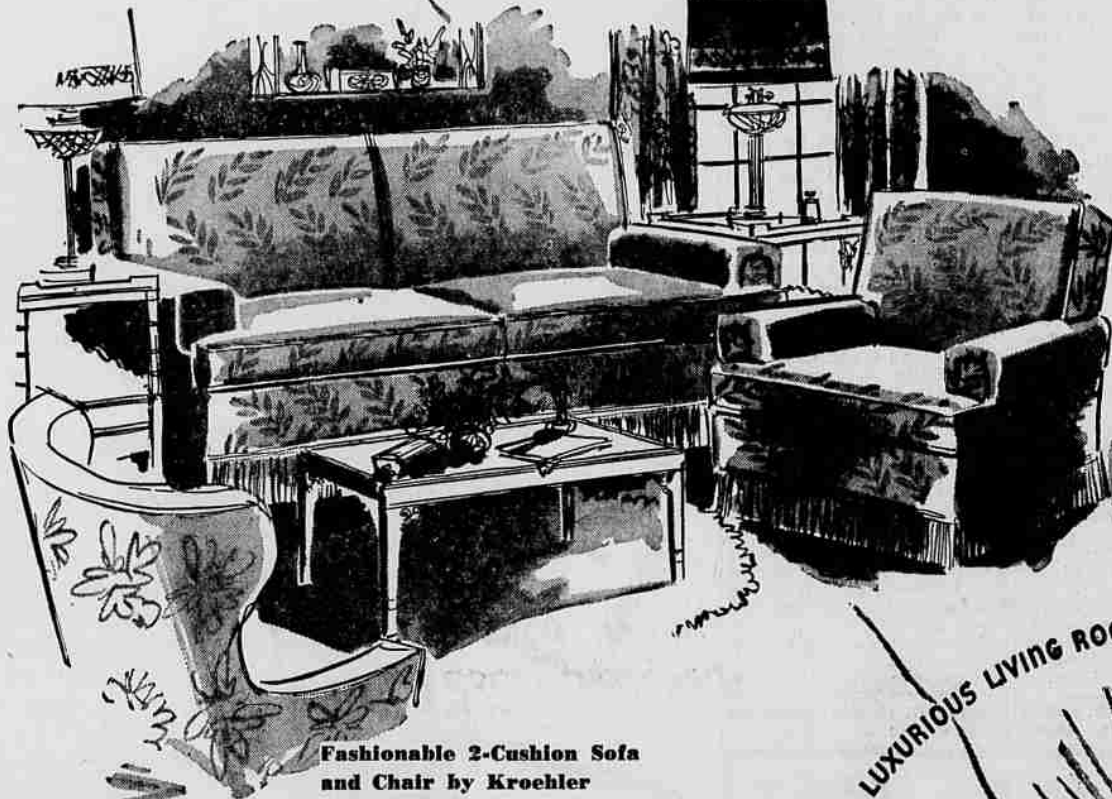
4. Shell the entire lot and weigh the resulting meats to determine the percentage of yield.
 5. Grade the walnut meats into commercial classes.
- Trunk added that Northwest nut growers will provide all possible assistance in making the cracking tests for grower members, but he could not guarantee that the association facilities will be adequate to keep up with the work. The nuts must be thoroughly dried before being brought to the shelling plant at Dundee, he added.

Official records of the proceedings of meetings were originally called minutes because they were recorded in minute or small writing, and later transcribed in a larger hand.

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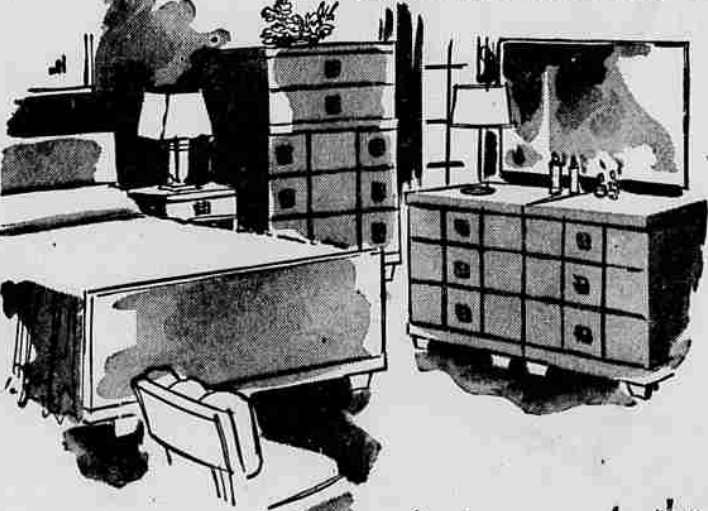
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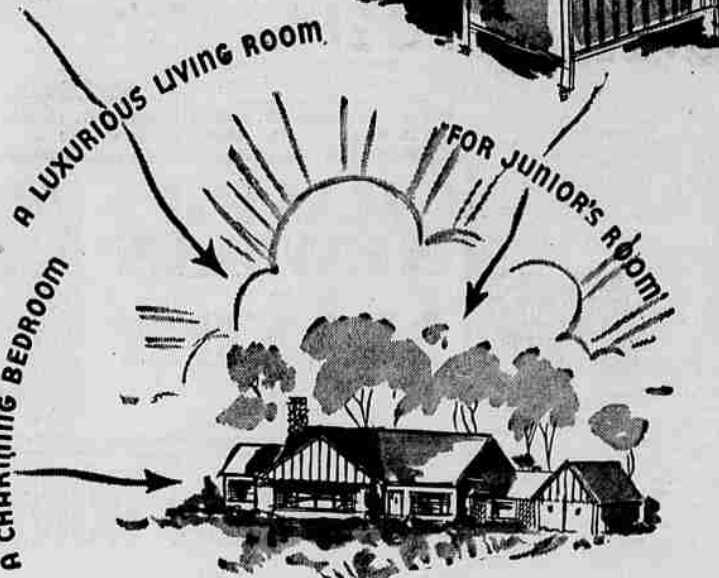
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
