

Labor Spends Record Funds

WASHINGTON—(AP)—A survey showed Wednesday that organized labor has raised and spent \$2,000,000 so far in this campaign, a record for union political activities.

Union leaders said that for their expenditures they expect, at the least, to elect a Democratic majority to the U. S. Senate and defeat proposed state labor control laws in Massachusetts, New Mexico and Arizona.

The more optimistic also expect to return President Truman to the White House and gain up to 36 seats in the House to give the Democrats full control of Congress.

An official of the AFL Political League estimated his organization alone would spend more than \$1,000,000 before the campaign is over. He said this includes amounts raised by state and local branches of the league but will not cover thousands of dollars raised and used exclusively in local and state elections.

Over \$500,000

A spokesman for the CIO Political Action Committee hinted that its expenditures will run "way over" \$500,000. In 1944, when this group was the most active labor political organization, expenditures of \$403,157 were reported to the Congress.

Unions in Massachusetts reportedly have raised more than \$200,000 to campaign against proposed state laws which would outlaw the closed and union shops.

Opposing Law

Besides the AFL and CIO, six other national labor organizations are raising money to oppose members of Congress who voted for the Taft-Hartley Law. Informed sources said they probably will spend a minimum of \$500,000.

They include John L. Lewis' United Mine Workers, railroad brotherhoods and the International Assn. of Machinists.

Nov. 3 Set for Bids On Airport Parking

Bids on construction of an addition to parking apron facilities at Mahlon Sweet Airport will be opened at the city hall Nov. 3 at 2 p. m., City Manager Deane Seeger has reported.

Approved by the city council at its last meeting, the project will be financed jointly by the city and the civil aeronautics administration. It also will include some drainage work.

When completed, the additional ramp space will facilitate Eugene's constantly increasing air lines service. Plans and specifications for the job are available at the city manager's office.

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Alaska Fifth Column Queried

JUNEAU, Alaska—(AP)—A congressional investigating committee is scheduled to leave Alaska by plane for San Francisco Wednesday after a tour during which it sought evidence of fifth-column activity in the territory.

Congressman Charles Kersten, a member of the committee, said the group found evidence of fifth column work in the Diomedes Islands but said he could not divulge its exact nature.

The committee said during a tour of Nome it learned Russia had information about the city which could only have come from Nome residents.

Leaders Subpoenaed

The group subpoenaed several labor union leaders Tuesday in a hearing on union activities in the Juneau area.

Territorial commissioner of labor Henry Benson was called to testify regarding the effects of the maritime strike on Alaska.

Asked "don't you think this strike is a menace to Alaska in its present role as guardian of the United States' northern defense?" Benson replied, "I certainly do."

In later testimony, he agreed with Kersten that the Soviets welcome "Communist-inspired labor walkouts which weaken Alaska."

Lane Gets \$111,286 For Road Purposes

Lane County Wednesday was in receipt of \$111,286 from the state in the form of state highway revenues.

The county was second on the list in the size of the allotment. Multnomah (Portland) received the largest amount, \$439,177, and Marion drew \$82,876 for third.

For the entire state, the receipts totaled \$1,447,943.

Computed on a basis of 19 per cent of revenue to the state in the form of gasoline taxes and other highway revenues, the money covered the three months ended Sept. 30.

The revenue goes into the Lane County budget for road purposes, the county treasurer stated.

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Army Tries Light Clothing

CHICAGO — (AP) — The Army, preparing for an eventually which might find our troops engaged in Arctic operations, has developed experimental, lighter weight clothing, a general said Wednesday.

Maj. Gen. William H. Middle-swart, chief of the military planning division of the office of the quartermaster general, said the new clothing weighs 21 pounds and will protect a man at 55 degrees below zero.

The present standard clothing ensemble weighs 25 pounds and protects a man at -40 degrees.

In a talk to the women's advertising club, he said the Army also had developed a catalytic heating pad that will keep a sleeping bag

heated for 20 hours. This bag would be used to evacuate wounded soldiers.

He said the Army was working on a similar unit that would provide added heat inside gloves and clothing when the apparel otherwise would be too bulky.

Speaking of light weight plastics, he said they might prove to be the answer to developing effective body armor for troops.

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Barkley Hits Policy Motives

HUNTINGTON, W. Va. — (AP) — Senator Albin W. Barkley Tuesday night accused Gov. Thomas E. Dewey of having "injected our foreign policy into this campaign for a selfish and partisan motive."

The Democratic vice-presidential nominee said the New York governor, Republican presidential nominee, had made "an extravagant and unwarranted claim" to authorship of the nation's bi-partisan foreign policy.

Claimed Ownership

He said Dewey made the claim last week in a speech at Louisville, Ky., in which he claimed "sole

ownership" of the bi-partisan foreign policy.

The truth of the matter, Barkley told an enthusiastic audience in city auditorium here, is that the bi-partisan policy was instituted by Franklin D. Roosevelt and Secretary of State Cordell Hull "long before the end of the war."
