

### Loggers End Coast Session

PORTLAND — (AP) — Western loggers headed back to the woods and offices Thursday after closing sessions of the three-day Pacific Logging Congress.

Resolutions adopted at the final assembly endorsed the policies of strike bound West Coast waterfront employers. The shippers were commended for their "efforts to bring stability to the Pacific Coast maritime industry."

Other resolutions supported the Taft-Hartley Labor Law; urged an improved system of access roads to tap natural resources, additional funds for the U. S. Weather Bureau's fire division and studies to encourage young men to enter the logging and lumbering business.

### Oregon Cows Too Eager

PORTLAND — (AP) — Oregon cows just won't read the state milk control regulations—and consequently Portland had too much butter last month.

The State Milk Control Board recently reduced the richness of the milk which may be legally sold here. But the cows went right on giving just as rich milk as ever.

With a shortage of drinking milk in this area, distributors bought extra milk in Washington, and separated it: adding the skim milk to the local supply to thin it down to the legal limits, and churning the butterfat into butter.

The result was that Portland—according to the milk control report of the State Department of Agriculture—had 32,855 pounds of surplus butterfat last month.

### Dependency Gap Found In Income Tax Law

LOS ANGELES — (AP) — Miss Augusta Rosenberg, lecturer in income taxation for the University of California extension, has found a discrepancy in the recently enacted federal income tax law which makes a certain type of young wage earner neither a dependent nor a taxpayer.

It seems that under the law, no one earning less than \$800 a year need pay income tax; however, the old law's definition of a dependent as one earning less than \$800 still stands.

"Consequently, Junior still will have to keep his earnings under \$800 to qualify as an exemption for father. Junior won't have to pay any tax himself unless he earns more than \$800," according to Miss Rosenberg.

If a youngster earns between \$800 and \$800, she said, he falls into an unclassified vacuum as far as the Bureau of Internal Revenue is concerned.

### First Women's Dean Dies

CHICAGO — (AP) — Miss Marion Talbot, the first woman ever to be given the title of dean of women at a university, died Wednesday at her Chicago home after a long illness. She was 90.

She started to work at the University of Chicago when it was founded in 1892, and three years later was officially designated dean of women.

The post had not been established at any other university until that time.

Miss Talbot retired in 1926, and since then has been a professor emerita of household administration at the university.
