Voters in Two States Ponder Liquor by-the-Drink Measure

PORTLAND—(AP)—Liquor-by-the-drink advocates in the bottle states of Oregon and Washington campaigned with parallel arguments this week in their drive to legalize the retail highball.

In both states, liquor-dispensing was developing rapidly into a major issue on the Nov. 2 general ballot, with the proponents led by prospective dispensers and the opponents led by temperance organizations.

State Licenses
Proposed initiative laws would authorize the Washington State Liquor Control Board and the Oregon Liquor Control Commission to issue liquor-by-the-drink dispensing licenses to hotels, restaurants, clubs, public carriers, and, in the case of Washington, tourist establishments.

In Oregon, the initiative would permit liquor-by-the-drink regardless of whether the dispenser serves food. The measure to be submitted to Oregonians bears the official title, "Oregon Liquor Dispensing Act."

Knox Amendment
The Oregon Liquor Commission would prescribe any further con-

ditions to be placed upon dispensers.

The measure, described by its supporters simply as a "modification" of the existing law which permits only beer and light wines in public establishments, calls for an annual license fee of \$500, a "performance" bond of \$5000, and, in addition to the purchase price of the liquor, a 25-cent tax on each 32 ounces. A one-cent tax would be assessed for each ounce over 32 in a container.

It goes on the ballot for a "yes" or "no" vote.

Historically, Oregon went on a state-control basis in 1933. Dr. William S. Knox, after months of study and survey, submitted a report to the state legislature which eventually enacted the Knox Act, placing the sale of high-powered alcoholic beverages, including "fortified" wine, in the hands of stores operated by the liquor commission. In succeeding years, Oregonians have fought off attempts to modify the law.

Chilled, But Steamed Up

LOS ANGELES—(AP)—When Mrs. Isabel Cotton thought her landlords were giving her the cold treatment she got plenty steamed up—enough to file a \$12,000 damage suit against Paul and Ida Tresser.

The Tressers, she charged, tried to drive her out of the house by cutting down the heat in her room, disconnecting all heat in the bathroom, nailing the bathroom windows open, and removing the bathroom shades.

Mrs. Cotton said she suffered bronchitis, insomnia, and gall bladder trouble from the resulting chill and embarrassment.

The defendants, denying the charges, said they gave Mrs. Cotton an eviction notice because their own lease had expired.

Tucker Faces More Charges

CHICAGO—(AP)—Four plaintiffs obtained federal court permission this week to file a second amended complaint charging Preston T. Tucker, automobile builder, and 17 other defendants with conspiring to defraud stockholders.

Among the charges in the amended complaint are:

That the first "Tucker Torpedo" which was advertised as having just come off the assembly lines was in reality a hand-built redesigned 1942 Oldsmobile.

That Tucker, president of the Tucker Corp., bought an airplane for \$40,000 of the corporation's money and leased it to the company for \$6,000 a month.

Bought Home
That Tucker used corporation money to buy a home near Bogota, Colombia, South America.

In a prepared statement, Tucker declared: "The accusations in this petition simply repeat the same unfounded charges that resulted in dismissal of the suit Sept. 25 by Judge Michael Igoe."

"It is inconceivable that supposedly intelligent attorneys could file a suit so rampant with inaccuracies as this one."

Mail Going Through To Pacific Areas

Acting Postmaster Ethan Newman announced Wednesday that the mail is "still going through" to the Pacific and South Pacific, despite the coastal shipping tie-up.

Newman made this statement in answer to many queries concerning the continuance of mail service to the Pacific areas during the strike. He said that the mail, however, is being re-routed out of New York and will take longer to be delivered.

Navy Working on New Rocket With a Close Shot Knock-Out

United Press Staff Correspondent WASHINGTON—(AP)—The Navy is working on a new-type rocket which experts believe will enable a fighter plane to knock out a bomber with one "close" shot, it was learned early in October.

A radio-controlled proximity fuse that would explode the rocket automatically when it neared its target is the trick in the highly-secret new weapon.

Navy rocket specialists said the proximity fuse rocket could be used against ground targets as well as in high-speed aerial combat.

The project combines two of the foremost weapon developments of World War II—the radio-controlled "VT" fuse, and the aircraft rocket.

Jet fighters and bombers offer new problems as high-speed targets. With the new rocket, Navy experts said, a fighter would not have to score a direct hit on another plane, but would only have

to come within a certain radius. The proximity fuse is a tiny radio in the nose of a projectile that sets off the explosive as soon as it reaches the magnetic field around the target. Specialists estimate that the rugged five-tube radio in the fuse would set off the explosive within 70 feet of an airplane. That is close enough to shower fragments on the target, they said.

It was not learned how far the new weapon has been developed. But it was understood it would be ready for any future war.

The 1200-pound "Tiny Tom" rockets wait at a rate of 900 feet per second in World War II. But postwar development of rocket motors is said to have more than tripled the speed of "whoosh" projectiles.

The new weapon is one reason Navy men are skeptical of the long-range bomber's ability to go anywhere without fighter escort. They argue that the efficiency of both fighters and radar has been increased so much that no bomber is safe by itself except in bad weather.

The proximity fuse was hailed for the unprecedented accuracy it gave gunfire during the war. It was used in the Navy's five-inch guns aboard ship, the Navy's main anti-aircraft weapon, and in artillery fire in France, and against Nazi buzz bombs over London.

Kidnaped Child Returned Safe

BALTIMORE—(AP)—Ten-week old Jo Ann Mezzanotte, fast asleep and well fed, was restored to her mother's arms Thursday some 21 hours after she had been snatched from her carriage.

Capt. Henry J. Kriss, captain of detectives, said Mrs. Leona Sheffield, 46-year-old mother of three, would be charged with stealing the baby.

Two detectives found Jo Ann on a bed at Mrs. Sheffield's home in suburban Dundalk.

They had been checking license numbers given them by Mrs. Frances Kucinski, who saw a strange woman toss a bundle of clothing into a cemetery and drive off.

Police commissioner Hamilton R. Atkinson arrived at police headquarters carrying Jo Ann in one hand and a bottle of milk in the other.

"Let me see my baby, just let me see her," cried 28-year-old Dolores Mezzanotte, the mother. She had left Jo Ann parked in her carriage outside a drug store while she went in to buy vitamin drops and a nursing bottle.

Capt. Kriss said Mrs. Sheffield told of having troubles and thought a new baby in the family might be the solution. He ordered that she be examined by psychiatrists.

Widow Gets Life

The court charged her with torturing Jews who served as slave laborers for Heydrich. The prosecution said that after Czech parachutists slew her husband in 1942, she demanded the death of anyone even suspected of having had a part in the killing.

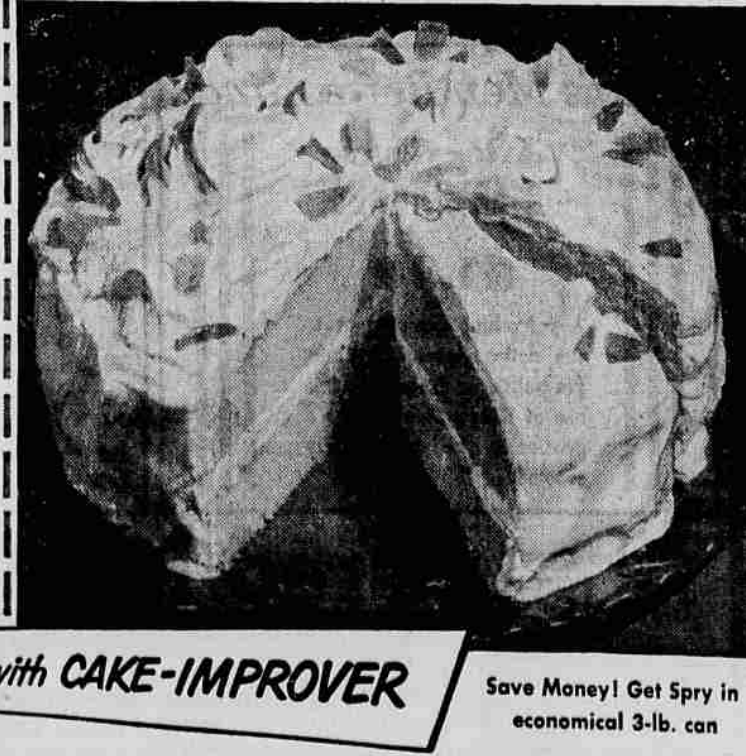
