Observer Sees No Deal Between Conservative G O P, Democrats

WASHINGTON — (U.P.) — Don't make any bets that some conservative Democrats make a deal with Republicans next January to assure continued GOP control of the United States Senate. No such is in sight.

If the Democrats regain their majority position in November election they will organize the Senate with a whoop of triumph. And if it comes out that way it will be the conservative southern Democrats again who will be on top.

Seniority Rules

Seniority rules the assignment of committee chairmanships, and the privilege and great power accompanying same. Senior Democrats, on most major committees are southern conservatives. They may be, as sometimes charged, more like Republicans than New

S F Red Labor Hearings Start

SAN FRANCISCO — (U.P.) — A House labor subcommittee opened a two-day hearing Friday to determine whether Communists were infiltrating into San Francisco labor ranks.

The two-man subcommittee was to place special emphasis on the West Coast maritime strike. Its members, Reps. Charles J. Kersten, (R-Wis.) and O. C. Fisher (D-Tex.), called 12 waterfront labor leaders and an employer spokesman among a total of 17 witnesses.

Bridges, Bryson

On the list were CIO Longshore Chief Harry Bridges and Hugh Bryson, leader of the CIO Marine Cooks and Stewards. Other witnesses were to represent the maritime firemen, CIO fishermen, National Maritime Union, marine engineers and marine radio officers.

The employer spokesman was Frank P. Foisie, president of the Waterfront Employers Assn. He has charged that the maritime strike resulted because the unions follow the Communist Party line. Each witness will be asked: "are you now or have you ever been a member of the Communist Party?"

Face Action

Any witness refusing to answer will be recommended for Department of Justice action.

Other developments in the maritime strike:

1. In New York, Joseph P. Ryan, president of the AFL International Longshoremen's Assn. threatened to strike East and Gulf coasts on Nov. 9. The Pacific Coast, with the exception of Tacoma, Wash., already is closed down.

2. In Washington, CIO President Philip Murray called on all CIO unions and councils to give moral and financial support to the West Coast strikers. He said he switched from his "hands-off" policy because of the industry's refusal to deal with elected union negotiation committees. He accused the industry of trying to dictate to unions.

Joyce Davis, Miss Oregon of 1948, threw the switch that sent power over the \$1,400,000 line from Tygh Valley to the Cove plant.

the Democrats to read him out of the party just because he is a third party candidate for vice-president. The late Robert M. La Follette, Sr., Republican, and former Sen. Burton K. Wheeler, Democrat, ran for president and vice-president on the Progressive Party ticket in 1924. The Republican old guard snorted a lot of threats but did not dare bounce La Follette out of the party. The Democrats made no move to punish Wheeler.

If the Democrats make a motion to assume Senate control next January and the vote is a tie, the motion will be lost and the Republicans will remain in control.

Secret Weapon

The secret Democratic weapon might be Sen. William Langer, a North Dakota Republican. He is politically unpredictable. Langer usually votes against his own party. He dodged a United Press inquiry whether he would vote for continued Republican control of the Senate next session.

Some persons believe the Democrats would be willing to continue Langer in his Civil Service Committee chairmanship if he helped the take over the Senate on Jan. 3.

One more point: Sen. Robert F. Wagner of New York is old, ill and a Democrat. If his seat soon becomes vacant Gov. Thomas E. Dewey would appoint a Republican to fill it, giving his party a gain of one Senate seat.

Reserve Arteries Added to Large Store of Spare Human Parts

BOSTON — (U.P.) — More spare parts for the human body may be available soon, the New England Journal of Medicine said Friday in reporting on experiments in preserving and transplanting arteries.

"As medical science has developed blood banks, eye banks and bone banks, so the way now seems clear for the establishment of artery banks," the Journal said.

It carried a report of experiments by Dr. Robert E. Gross, Harvard Medical School professor and surgeon-in-chief at Children's Hospital, and three associates who grafted arteries to patients with "very encouraging results."

The first success came in the transplanting of the abdominal aorta, the main artery going through the abdomen of dogs.

Segments Stored

The segments of the arteries were stored in flasks containing a special solution to which was added glucose, dog serum, penicillin and streptomycin. The specimens were refrigerated at a temperature of one to four degrees centigrade for 35 to 40 days before being implanted in recipient dogs.

Twenty-four such grafts were made with "almost universal success," the report said.

Human Experiment

The next step was to try the process on human beings. Sections of artery were obtained within a few hours from the bodies of persons who had died in automobile accidents, and were preserved and stored as had been the dog arteries.

These sections were used to bridge arterial gaps in operations performed for the relief of congenital heart and vessel defects. Operations Reported

Twelve such operations were reported by Drs. Gross, Elliott S. Hurwitz, Alexander H. Bill and E. Converse Peirce. Of these, two of the patients died, but the remaining 10 survived "with greatly improved circulation."

"It is too soon to give any final evaluation," the doctors said. "However the early postoperative results are very encouraging, and they certainly warrant further trial and study when no other means are available for satisfactorily bridging a gap in a large vessel of the arterial system."

PORTLAND — (U.P.) — Portland's ordinance against horse-race bookmaking was under study of three circuit court judges Friday.

The case reached them Thursday on the city's appeal from a ruling by Municipal Judge John B. Seabrook that the ordinance conflicted with the state racing act and was invalid.

The judges, Walter L. Toose, Ashby C. Dickson and James R. Bain, heard arguments, then took the case under advisement.
