Swiss Angry At Rodeo Bet

GENEVA, Switzerland —(P)—
A rodeo company "from the sav-
age west" put on a combination
rodeo and riot Sunday night at
the Palais des Expositions. The
event left policemen and per-
formers bruised and ruffled and
27 of the cast of 40 under arrest.
The trouble started when a
hardy Genevan took up the rodeo
company's offer of 1000 Swiss
francs (about \$250) to anyone
who stayed on the back of a
bronco named "income tax" for
10 seconds.
The Swiss horseman, whose
name was lost in the scuffle, de-
clared he rode "income tax" for
10 seconds.
The cowboys — who billed
themselves as coming from Texas
—said he was up only four sec-
onds and not on any bronco
named "income tax." The argu-
ment roared into a free-for-all.
Somewhere in the melee a cow-
girl was bashed on the head with
a club.
