

John J. Van Lierop Takes Post at Solemn Ceremonies

At 7:30 p. m., the Presbyterian church of Willamette will install John J. Van Lierop as pastor of the Fairmount Presbyterian church, 15th and Villard sts., at 11 a. m. Rev. Van Lierop will conduct the worship service.

Van Lierop will be "Why Protestants?" in honor of the day Martin Luther was born. He will read his 95 theses on the door of the church, and thereby began the movement which is called Protestantism.

The installation service will be held at 7:30 p. m. and Lord's Prayer will be read by Rev. Ralph E. Clark. Scripture will be read by Marion Booth of Albany.

Charge to the pastor will be by Rev. Paul S. Mellish, of the Central Presbyterian church, Eugene. Constitution will be read, and charge to the congregation will be given by Rev. G. Henry of Portland, executive secretary of the Synod of Oregon.

Van Lierop's church, which he will lead, is a fine example of the service which is being rendered by the church in the city. Van Lierop was born in Wash., but when he was a boy, the family moved to Belgium, where he was called to be a minister. For the past several years he has conducted Bible conferences and revival meetings throughout the country and is especially gifted in Bible exposition, reports the local pastor, Rev. Richard S. Taylor.

The school is open to all children who may wish to attend.

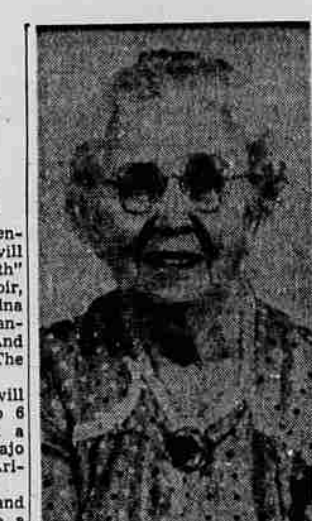
