

See Oregon Jurists to Hear Law School Arguments

Three prominent jurists will hear the final arguments of the appellate arguments of the University of Oregon law school, Nov. 12. Hall S. Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of Oregon, will act as justice; Dal M. King, circuit justice; Coos and Curry, and George R. Dunsmuir, judge for Marion County, will be associate justices. The arguments will be at 7:30 p.m., in Room 3 Fenton Hall. The public is invited.

Supervising the argument competition is a student "committee of the presiding justice." Serving on this committee for the fall term are Avery Combs, third year law student from Camas, Wash., as presiding justice; Donald Krause, third year law student, Portland, and Ralph Johnson, third year law student, Eugene. Allan Hugh Smith, assistant professor of law, is faculty adviser. Award for the winning team is a set of the Oregon Compiled Laws Annotated, given each year by the law firm of Koerner, Young, Swett, and McCulloch of Portland.

Japanese Kids Await Entry

SEATTLE—(AP)—A University of Washington sociology instructor, who married a Japanese woman while serving on the U. S. naval staff in Japan two years ago, now seeks to bring his Japanese twin step-daughters to this country.

The war brides act permitted David Carpenter to bring his wife and their son, Gary, back to the United States. But her three-year-old daughters by a previous marriage, Teiko and Yoshiko Higo, could not return with her. They are living with grandparents.

"I'm the only father they've ever known," Carpenter said explaining the situation. "They never saw their father."

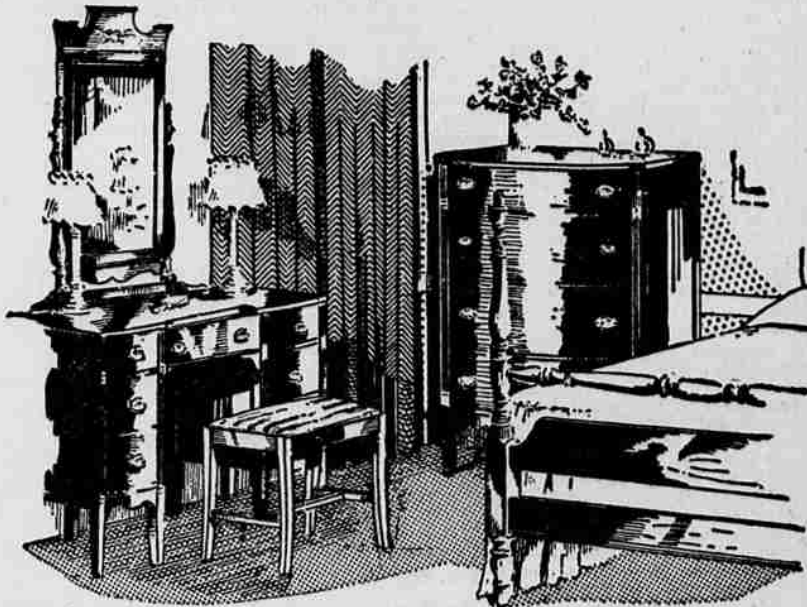
Father Killed
Their father, Capt. Ichiji Higo, commandant of the Japanese naval station at Canton, was killed shortly after the Japanese surrender. Carpenter met his future wife, the daughter to a Japanese baron, while on naval staff duty as chief of the Statistics Division. Carpenter's mother in St. Louis has persuaded Congressman Walter C. Ploeser to submit a special House resolution in Congress to admit them, he said.

"I hope Congress will realize 3-year-old girls need a mother," Carpenter added. "My wife's happiness would be complete if the twins were with us."

This is a program that has been under consideration for some time, Cashman said. The new agencies will take care of the needs of their many customers in the two cities and adjacent territory.



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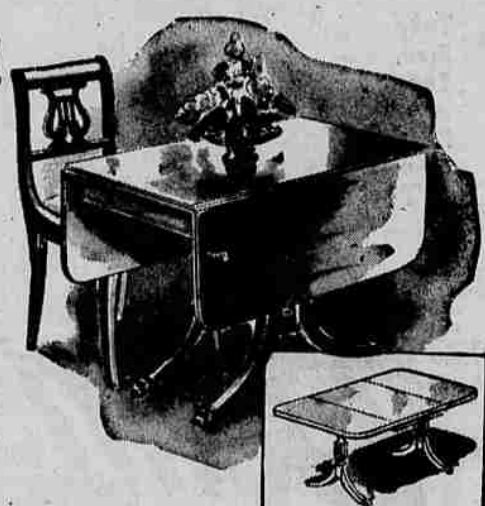
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
