

Day Strike Nearer End
SAN FRANCISCO—(U.P.)—Shell companies collapsed yesterday, ending all hopes of a 57-day California strike in the immediate future.
Conciliation Chief Glenn announced further bar conferences with the CIO have been adjourned with no meetings scheduled.
"There appears to be no hope for agreement at the Shell Co. in the early future," Bowers said. "The effect of this deadlock on negotiations with other companies cannot be forecast."
The complete breakdown came on the heels of Shell's announcement Friday night that a rebellious group of officials from Local 5 at Martinez—scene of recurrent disturbances—had "taken over" negotiations and "nullified" progress during the past week.

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TO THE VOTERS OF EUGENE THE BYERS STORY

"THE HIGHWAY COMMISSION PREFERS TO MAKE NO RECOMMENDATION TO THE CITY PLANNING COMMISSION REGARDING CHANGE OF ZONE EXCEPT WHERE SUCH CHANGE WOULD SERIOUSLY IMPAIR THE USEFULNESS OF THE HIGHWAY. IN THE PRESENT INSTANCE IT WOULD SEEM TO BE NO SERIOUS DETERENT TO HIGHWAY TRAVEL AND PURELY A MATTER TO BE CONSIDERED AS AFFECTING THE RESIDENTIAL AREA OF THE CITY."
"IF AND WHEN THE CHANGE OF ZONE IS APPROVED, WE WILL ISSUE A PERMIT TO THE CITY FOR A 4-INCH SEWER AND A PERMIT TO THE MOUNTAIN STATES POWER COMPANY FOR THE GAS ACROSS THE HIGHWAY, AND MARK THE CURBS AND SUPERVISE THE INSTALLATION OF THE DRIVEWAY ENTRANCE AND EXIT. EACH 25 FEET WIDE. MR. BYERS UNDERSTANDS THAT HE WILL BE REQUIRED TO BUILD THE DRIVEWAY ENTRANCE AND EXIT AT HIS OWN EXPENSE."

VOTE 500 X YES
BECAUSE: The Franklin Boulevard area is now considered a commercial area rather than a residential area and the proper use for the public good is that of business.

VOTE 500 X YES
BECAUSE: The operation of a business upon the property will not create the detriment to traffic as claimed by the opposition to Ordinance 9125 to any greater extent than other business in any other location. IF THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A BUSINESS ON THE HENRY BYERS PROPERTY WOULD CREATE A TRAFFIC HAZARD, WHY WAS THIS NOT APPARENT AND SO STATED BY THE STATE HIGHWAY ENGINEER IN HIS LETTER OF JANUARY 12, 1946, PART OF WHICH HAS BEEN QUOTED ABOVE?

BECAUSE: The classification of this property to business IS NOT SPOT-ZONING. The undeniable records in the City Hall will show that THE HENRY BYERS PROPERTY IS VIRTUALLY THE ONLY PROPERTY WHICH HAS NOT BEEN GIVEN AN ABSOLUTE BUSINESS CLASSIFICATION. The classification of this property to business will coincide with the evident intent of the Eugene Planning Commission and the City Council to classify the Franklin Boulevard a commercial area.

One-Way Signs Now on Way for Eugene's Streets
Signs to be used in marking Eugene's downtown system of one-way streets, scheduled for a trial-period introduction in November, have been shipped from the manufacturer, the city manager's office reported Saturday.
The one-way traffic control plan has been approved for introduction as soon as the 249 signs can be put into place. In authorizing its trial, the city council was informed that the plan may permit handling of 60 per cent more traffic in the business district.

Radical Scare Spreads To Church Convention
PHILADELPHIA — (U.P.) — The Rev. Carl McIntire, a New Jersey Presbyterian, says five major Protestant churches spread "Socialist principles" in Sunday school literature.
Rev. McIntire told 100 delegates to the American Council of Christian Churches Saturday that Socialist theories are published in literature of the Presbyterian Church in the U. S., the Northern Baptist Convention, Methodist Church, Congregational Christian Church and the Protestant Episcopal Church.
The council also passed a resolution opposing appointment of John Foster Dulles, Gov. Thomas E. Dewey's foreign affairs advisor, "to either the position of Secretary of State or representative of the United States in the United Nations."
The resolution called Dulles "an effective tool of extremely radical and pacifist church leaders."

OFFICERS AT SCHOOL
Attending a police training school at Klamath Falls last week were Officers George W. Howard and R. T. Nelson of the Eugene force. Sponsored by the Oregon Assn. of City Police Officers, the FBI and Oregon state police in conjunction with the Oregon vocational school, the instruction period in basic police subjects attracted officers from all parts of the state.

McMINNVILLE — (U.P.) — The new \$350,000 memorial grade school will be formally opened here Monday.

Lumber Shipments Highest Since 1942
SEATTLE — (U.P.) — Forest products carloadings in the Pacific Northwest during the first nine months of the year were the highest for any similar period since 1942.
The Pacific Northwest advisory board said the 305,977 figure compares with 283,787 for the same period in 1947. The board's figures cover Washington, Oregon and Northern Idaho.

Deer Hunting Season 'Is Definitely Closed'
The deer hunting season definitely closed Oct. 20, despite a news service story from Portland last week to the effect that the season would remain open until mid-November. State police report they must arrest anyone violating the game laws, which closed the deer season Oct. 20.
Migratory waterfowl shooters are also warned they must have duck stamps pasted to their licenses. Although the local post-office sold out the supply Friday, an additional 5000 were placed on sale Saturday.

Police Lieutenant Shot In a Hunting Accident
Delmar E. Cash, lieutenant in charge of the Eugene police department's traffic division, was reported in good condition Saturday afternoon at the Eugene Hospital where he was taken for treatment of a gunshot wound received in a hunting accident.
Cash was hunting ducks early Saturday with Byron D. Agarter, 1680 Mill St. Agarter slipped and his gun discharged. Cash was standing about 75 feet away and was struck in the left side. The accident happened west of the city in the Amazon Flats district.

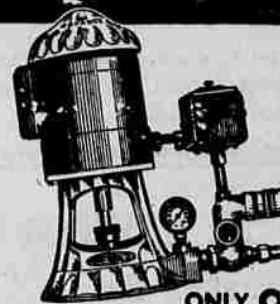
