Dewey Carries 92 County Precincts

Despite the national Democratic trend that swept Harry S. Truman to victory and four years of headaches, Lane County, a Republican stronghold, went for Thomas E. Dewey in 92 out of the 123 precincts with a 5000-vote margin.

Precincts that voted strong for President Truman were Oakridge, Westfir, Lost Valley, Mapleton, Row River, Walton, Veneta, Blachly, Swisshome, Eugene No. 1 and No. 2, and Springfield No. 1, 4, 5, 6 and 7. The President carried Five Rivers by 1 vote, according to unofficial tabulations, and tied with Dewey in Camp Creek.

But 10 of the precincts carried by Dewey were by 5 votes or fewer, and noteworthy in these precincts is the vote cast for Progressive Candidate Henry A. Wallace and the perennial Socialist candidate, Norman Thomas.

Henry Wallace showed strength in 15 precincts, several of which went Democratic, but President Truman would not have carried Lane County even with the Socialist and Progressive votes. Although he fell below the estimation of the pollsters nationally Wallace received 10 to 25 votes in Fall Creek, Lost Valley, Oakridge, Blanton, Florence, Mapleton, Row River, Santa Clara, Veneta, Willaglespie, Eugene Nos. 20 and 24, and Springfield Nos. 5, 6 and 7.

Four areas with 10 to 30 votes each for Norman Thomas were Blanton, Santa Clara, and Eugene Nos. 19 and 24. Precinct 20, Eugene, which showed a high tabulation for both Thomas and Wallace is on the University of Oregon campus, and includes the vote of the Veterans' Dormitories.

Accident Brings Dark To East Springfield

SPRINGFIELD — The east Springfield area was in darkness for several minutes Thursday when power lines were cut as a Mountain States Power Company pole was sheared off by a logging truck.

The accident occurred at 4:30 p. m. on East Main Street and Seavey Rd. The loaded trailer on a log truck became unhitched and ran into a pole, cutting it off. Ten pairs of telephone lines also were downed. Full service was restored by late Thursday evening.
