The Rev. Harry G. Humphrey, 75, minister of Tangent Methodist Church, died at an Albany hospital Nov. 4. Born in Lancaster County, Pa., Feb. 10, 1873, he would have ended his 50th year in the ministry of the church this year. The last 16 years he spent in Oregon. His charges in this state included Jason Lee Memorial Church, Salem, Fremont St. Community Church, Portland, Oak Grove Community Church, and Tangent. Before coming to Oregon his appointments included Twin Falls, Idaho, Helena and Dillon, Mont., and district superintendencies in both Idaho and Montana. In addition he founded the Broadway Methodist Church in Kansas City, Mo., and in 1907 served other pastorates in Kansas City and Independence, Mo.  
Surviving are his widow; a daughter, Mrs. M. C. Elliott, Nampa, Idaho; two sons, Howard, of Reedsport, and a son in North Hollywood, Calif.  
Services will be at Tangent Methodist Church Monday at 10 a.m., with the Rev. Roy Fedje of Salem District, superintendent of Methodist Churches, officiating. Concluding services will be at Mt. Crest Crematorium in Salem. Fortmiller-Fredricksen Mortuary of Albany will have charge.
