An offering of eighty-five dollars and a total of a hundred and sixty gift parcels, destined for teen-age youngsters among the displaced persons of Europe were gathered at the World Community Day observance Friday evening in Eugene. It was sponsored by the Eugene Council of Church Women. The program was outlined as follows: a forum of speakers including Miss Mary Magers and Kenneth Neal, representing the schools; W. M. Tugman, representing the press; and the Rev. Paul Mellis, for the church. The theme was "Peace Is My Responsibility." Soloist was Robert Near, Mary Grubbs organist, and the All-Girl Choir of First Congregational Church, where the meeting was held, sang.

Mrs. Victor P. Morris was general chairman, and Mrs. Henry R. Burch appeared as president of the church women. The Rev. Richard Taylor and the Rev. Wesley G. Nicholson gave invocation and benediction. Refreshments were served in the Wheeler Room, where Mrs. Nicholson and Mrs. Burch poured. Mrs. Henry Tromp had the guest book. Decorations were by Mrs. George Davis.
