

Mrs. Luce Says Need Religion

SEATTLE —(U.P.)— Ex-congresswoman Clare Boothe Luce, noted Catholic convert, warned students celebrating Seattle University's 50th anniversary Tuesday that the Pacific Northwest will take the brunt of the next war and urged a "spiritual spearhead" against Communism.

The largest Catholic institute of learning on the Pacific Coast celebrated its golden jubilee with the very Rev. Msgr. Charles D. McInnis of Newton, Mass., sounding the keynote. He said:

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realize that man is the spiritual coin of God's realm. We reject the philosophy which teaches that the only coin which counts is that which bears the likeness of Caesar.

Mrs. Luce more specifically urged students to regard themselves as the spiritual spearhead of all decent peoples' attack on Communism and fellow travelers.

If war comes again, she warned, the Pacific Northwest "will be in the very forefront of the physical battle."

Christian Nation

Later in an address at the Olympic Hotel's Spanish ballroom, she pleaded for a Christian nation built on Christian education.

"Our great secular universities... are becoming more and more agnostic and materialistic and less and less Christian," she said.

"Atheists," she said, "are fellow travelers without knowing it. They always wind up in the camp of Communists."

Her serious speech included typically salty Lucisms—"I introduced a resolution on God in the Congress, and they had a terrible time referring it to the proper committee. Finally they sent it to the Committee of Foreign Affairs."

County Building Rules Proposed

praisal and assessment of new or altered structures by the county assessor.

Some Not Covered

The regulations of the ordinance will apply to the construction, alteration or enlargement of any building or structure in Lane County, outside of incorporated cities, the value of which is \$200 or more (material and labor); except structures specifically required for grazing, agriculture, horticulture, or the growing of timber.

The county surveyor is authorized by the ordinance to care for the issuing of permits. He is also empowered to delegate such authority to city clerks or engineering offices in incorporated cities in Lane County.

Where Issued

Permits may be issued by mail or at the county surveyor's office in the Lane County Court House, or in any incorporated city in the county.

A flat fee of 50 cents will be charged for each building permit. These fees are payable to the general fund of Lane County except 25 cents which will be de-

ducted by the office issuing the permit.

60-Day Grace

Under the ordinance permits issued will cover only the work specified. A portion of the work must be started within 60 days after the permit is issued, and all work must be completed within one year.

The ordinance regulations require that the following be furnished the office of the county surveyor before a permit is issued:

1. A sketch showing the property and the location of structures to be covered by permit.

2. Sketch showing the location or proposed location of the well or water source (if other than a public water supply), and the location or proposed location of the pit toilet or septic tank and leaching lines. Other information will be filled out in full on a special permit form.

If the approved ordinance is passed by the county court any person, firm, corporation, or partnership violating the regulations of the ordinance may be fined not less than \$25 nor more than \$100.

Motor Industry Faces Controls

WASHINGTON —(U.P.)— The congressional committee probing auto sales profits gave the motor industry the choice of "cleaning its own house" or facing possible federal controls.

At the same time, the committee turned over to the Justice Department and the Internal Revenue Bureau the official record of two days of hearings marked by testimony about "tips" to salesmen for quick car deliveries.

Chairman Macy (R-NY), head of the special House group which ended its hearings Tuesday, said that disclosures so far cover "only a few of the methods" some dealers have used "to obtain exorbitant profits."

Macy said it will be up to the Justice Department to determine whether there have been any law violations in selling cars with side money agreements or in requiring

purchasers to take unwanted accessories.

An the Internal Revenue Bureau, the lawmakers added, can decide whether taxes have been paid on the tips and bonuses received but according to committee evidence, not recorded on sales slips.

Macy and Rep. Larcade (D-La.), who conducted the hearings, predicted there will be large recoveries in income taxes.

Macy said the committee believes that dealers are entitled to "a fair profit" but contends that "the profits made by some dealers go far beyond this point and the methods through which this profit is obtained go beyond what can be termed ethical business practices."

"It would be deplorable," he said in a statement, "if the greed and avarice of a few dealers and the lack of effective program on the part of manufacturers should catapult an entire basic industry of the country into thorough disrepute and even the possibility of controls."

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FBI 'Mother' Dead at 80

SAN FRANCISCO —(U.P.)— Mrs. Florence Prag Kahn, first widow to succeed her husband in Congress and a California representative for 12 years, is dead at 80.

She was elected to the House two months after her husband, congressman Julius Kahn, died in December, 1924. He had held the post since 1899.

J. Edgar Hoover called her "the mother of the Federal Bureau of Investigation" because of her constant battles for money for the FBI.

She was the first woman member of the Military Affairs and Appropriations Committees of the House.
