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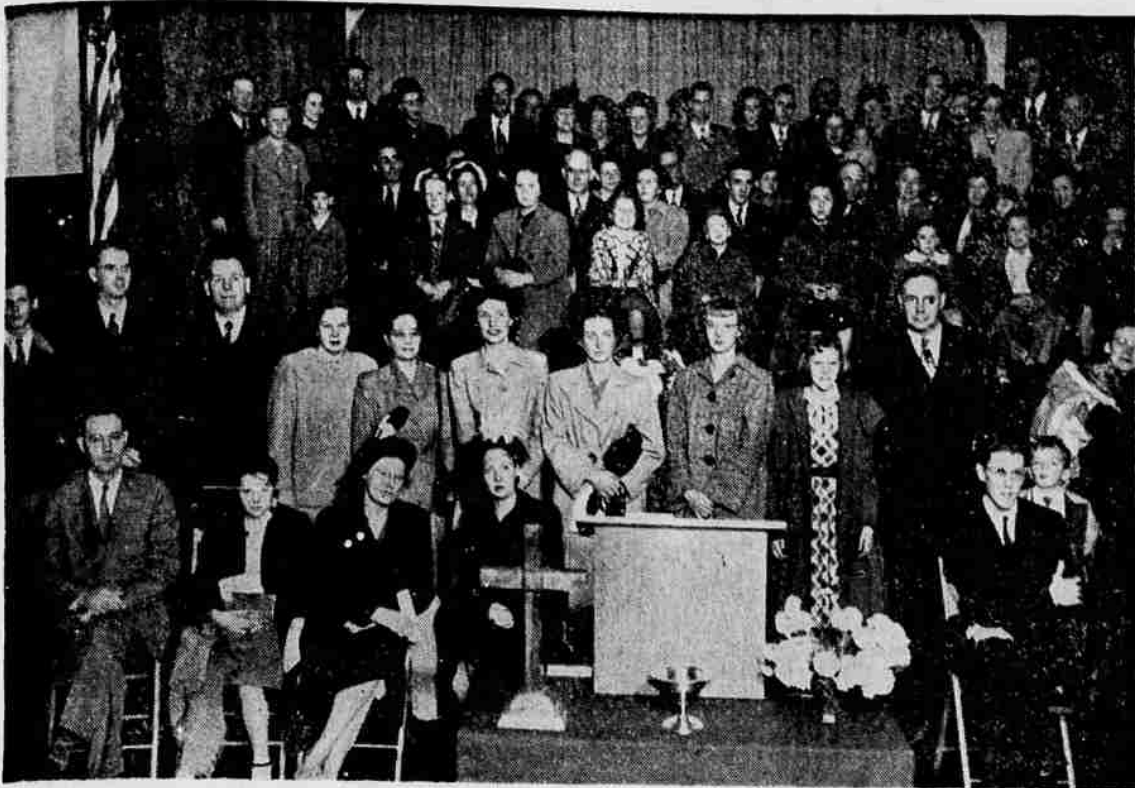

Council Church Women Strikes at Segregation

MILWAUKEE—The United Council of Church Women closes its national convention today with election of officers and discussions on problems concerning Indians and Negroes. Mrs. Harper Sibley, a 61-year-old grandmother from Rochester, N. Y., was re-elected to a third term as council president.

In its closing ceremonies, the council will dedicate itself to the principles of civil rights and economic justice.

Last night, a leading churchwoman, Mrs. J. D. Bragg of St. Louis, called upon the church to lead society away from the practices of "discrimination and segregation."

The church women voted to leave the question of merger with the proposed national council of churches up to the 1949 board.

A Catholic Prayer of Thanksgiving

The following prayer was composed A.D. 1800 by John Carroll, the first Archbishop of Baltimore. It is read in Catholic churches throughout the United States on Thanksgiving Day:

"We pray Thee, O Almighty and Eternal God, Who through Jesus Christ hast revealed Thy glory to all nations, to preserve the works of Thy mercy; that Thy Church, being spread through the whole world, may continue, with unchanging faith, in the confession of Thy name."

"We pray Thee, Who alone art good and holy, to endow with heavenly knowledge, sincere zeal, and sanctity of life, our chief bishop Pius, the Vicar of our Lord Jesus Christ in the government of His Church; our own Bishop; all other Bishops, Prelates and Pastors of the Church...."

"We pray Thee, O God of might, wisdom, and justice through Whom authority is rightly administered, laws are enacted, judgment decreed, assist, with Thy Holy Spirit of counsel and fortitude, the President of these United States, that his administration may be conducted in righteousness, and be eminently useful to Thy people, over whom he presides, by encouraging due respect for virtue and religion; by a faithful execution of the laws in justice and mercy; and by restraining vice and immorality. Let the light of Thy divine wisdom direct the deliberations of Congress, and shine forth in all the proceedings and laws framed for our rule and government; so that they may tend to the preservation of peace, the promotion of national happiness, the increase of industry, sobriety, and useful knowledge, and may perpetuate to us the blessings of equal liberty."

"We pray for His Excellency, the Governor of this State, for the members of the Assembly, for all Judges, Magistrates, and other officers who are appointed to guard our political welfare; that they may be enabled, by Thy powerful protection, to discharge the duties of their respective stations with honesty and ability."

"We recommend likewise to Thy unbounded mercy all our brethren and fellow-citizens, throughout the United States, that they may be blessed in the knowledge, and sanctified in the observance of Thy most holy law; that they may be preserved in union and in that peace which the world cannot give; and, after enjoying the blessings of this life, be admitted to those which are eternal."

"Finally, we pray Thee, O Lord of mercy, to remember the souls of Thy servants departed who are gone before us with the sign of faith, and repose in the sleep of peace... Through Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior." Amen.

"WHERE TWO OR THREE ARE GATHERED TOGETHER IN MY NAME"

"A great person came to town last Sunday: However, there was no beating drums nor blowing of trumpets to announce His arrival; there was no parade to welcome and honor Him. You see, most people had forgotten that He promised to come and was busy; some were working, others were entertaining friends; some just resting. Some who had heard that He was to come went to meet Him at the fashionable places and thus missed Him. Some happened along at the right place and were present, but were so absorbed in their own affairs that they were oblivious of His presence."

"I was about to say that there was no feast held in His honor, but I remembered a few trusted friends with whom He did spread a simple meal in His honor. They said something about doing this 'in remembrance of Him,' and showing His death until He comes. One person (she had been solemn and reverent) was heard to say that the many cars loaded upon her shoulders had been hard to bear, but since that visit she now had the strength to carry on. I heard Him ask about some of His friends who are usually present for His visit, but who for some reason were absent. I heard him say: 'Fa ther, forgive them and help them not to be thoughtless and neglectful again.' He promised to return soon. Would you care to go with me next Sunday to meet Him?"
