Professor to Present Economics Paper

Dr. Zenon Sztrowski, associate professor of economics at the University of Oregon, will present a paper on "Oscillatory Models in Measuring Persistency Characteristics of Economic Time Series" in Cleveland, Ohio, Dec. 30. The occasion is a joint conference of the Economics Assn., the American Statistical Assn. and the Econometrics Society, Dec. 27-30. The purpose of his paper, the Oregon statistician explained, is to demonstrate cyclical patterns in the future by information gleaned from studying series of production or price figures over a long period. This information is useful to the businessman in planning investment and problems, he said.
