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Husky Tankmen Crack Record as OSC Beaten

SEATTLE, Jan. 31 — (AP) — The University of Washington swimming team Monday held new Northern Division Pacific Coast Conference records and one new meet mark as a result of its 70-14 victory over Oregon State in a dual meet Saturday night.

The three-man Husky team churned through the 300-yard medley in 2:53.1 to better the old mark of 2:49.3 also established by a Washington team.

George Heaney and Pete Salmon established new meet records. Heaney established a new 150-yard backstroke in 1:39.3. Salmon stroked to a new record in the 200-yard backstroke when he negotiated the distance in 2:26.2.

Bob Reagan of Washington set a new Northern Division mark when he covered the 150-yard medley in 1:46.

The Husky mermen won every event, sweeping first two places in all but one. Oregon State won second and third in the 50-yard freestyle.

Ernie Hoff's 313.2 points in diving established him as a Northern Division favorite for future competition.

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
