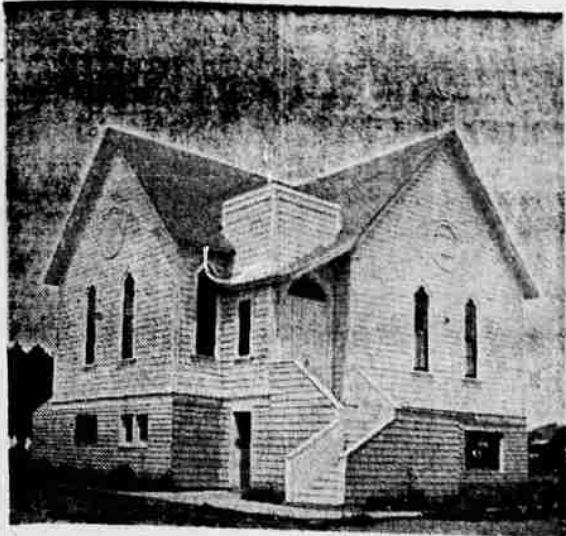

Goshen Church Shows Way to Renovation Problem Solutions

GOSHEN—What can be done to an old church building to make it serviceable for a modern congregation is aptly illustrated by the remodeling job recently done on the Church of Christ at Goshen.

The building has been raised to provide living quarters for the pastor and additional classrooms, exterior painted, asbestos roof

added and a new stairway added to replace the steep original one. The inside has been thoroughly renovated, including new pews, modern electrical light fixtures, two coats of white paint and the floors sanded and varnished.

A sawdust burner was donated by Earl Lohrey. Everett Gustafson, former pastor, donated the paint and did the painting with a spray outfit. All the work has been done by the members and the pastors.

Ray L. Charlesworth is resident minister and with Mrs. Charlesworth and two children occupies the living quarters in the church.

C G Churches Active Week

COTTAGE GROVE — The Church of Christ on Monroe Avenue near Fifth Street, with H. G. Cassell as minister, will feature two interesting studies in its Sunday sermons. In his morning study the minister will expound the parable of "The Wheat and The Tares." At eventide he will offer a searching analysis of "The Apostles Barnabas and Paul at Their Work as Missionaries."

Father Leipzig Looks Back Over Long Eugene Ministry

The Very Reverend Francis P. Leipzig is entering his 21st year as pastor of St. Mary's Catholic Church of Eugene.

He arrived in Eugene in January of 1929, coming from St. Mary's Catholic Church of Corvallis, and succeeding Father Edwin V. O'Hara, now Bishop O'Hara of Kansas City, Mo.

In 1929 all Lane County was under the pastorate of Father Leipzig, who was assisted in this work by the late Father Daniel P. Curley.

Only one parish church existed in this vast territory, supplemented by two mission churches at Springfield and Cottage Grove.

These two priests cared for the Catholics of this county until the fall of 1932 when Father Curley was appointed as pastor of St. Rose's Catholic Church in Monroe, leaving the entire work in the hands of Father Leipzig. He was assisted, however, in his Sunday work by Father Basil, Order of St. Benedict, until the arrival of the late Father Richard E. Carberry in the summer of 1934.

The growth of the Catholic Church in Lane County is readily observed in the change of the two missions at Springfield and Cottage Grove to resident parishes under the direction of Father Louis H. Sohler and Father Paul Zeller. In addition to the newly created parish in these cities, two missions have been established at Oakridge and McKenzie Bridge under the direction of Father Romuald Edenhofner, O.S.B., and Father Finnian Carrol, Order of the Franciscan Order Minor, Capuchian.

Additional priests have been placed in Eugene, namely two assistants in St. Mary's Parish, Father Basil Engertberger, O.S.B., and Father Jermiah Linehan. A Catholic chaplain has been stationed since 1936 at Sacred Heart Hospital, the present chaplain being Father William Hampson.

The increase to eight priests in this county is reflected in the fact that membership of the church in Lane County has more than doubled. In 1929 only four masses were said each Sunday in Eugene and the missions of Springfield and Cottage Grove. At present the eight priests are saying 14 masses each Sunday.

The enrollment of St. Mary's Grade and High School has kept pace. Twenty years ago upon the arrival of Father Leipzig there were 195 enrolled in the grades and 55 in the high school, totaling 250. At the present time there are 833 registered in the grades and 199 in the high school, with a total of 732.

In 1929 the parish was faced with a debt of \$97,000 arising from the building of the present Catholic church and the purchase of property. Slow progress was made in the retiring of the debt during the depression years. However the entire debt was completely paid at the time of the Silver Jubilee to the Priesthood of the present pastor in April, 1945. In addition to the payment of the parish debt the parish had completed in 1940 and paid for the
