

Some Salesmen Violating City Licensing Ordinance

Some local business houses apparently are not aware that all house-to-house salesmen or solicitors must be licensed by the city, under Henry Beistel reported Monday.

Persons regularly employed in place-to-place solicitation of business, magazine sales and others, are generally complying with the city licensing ordinance, some salesmen, who occasionally make a round of soliciting calls are not meeting provisions of the ordinance, Beistel said.

The recorder explained that the ordinance defines a solicitor as "any person who goes from house-to-house or place-to-place selling or taking orders for goods or services." The ordinance does not specify as to the frequency of the practice.

Solicitors' licenses can be obtained at the recorder's office, Beistel said.

either 30 days after the time of application or upon the posting of a \$1000 bond. The license fee is \$5 a fiscal year.

Aside from wholesalers' agents who sell to merchants, the only other house-to-house salesmen excepted under the ordinance are those taking orders for the sale of fruits, vegetables, berries, butter, eggs, milk, poultry, meats or farm products raised or produced by the person offering them for sale.

Tickets on Sale
Tickets will be on sale at both Eugene banks and other stores, with places and dates to be announced. Banks at Springfield, and Junction City also will have a supply of tickets.

Posters which will appear in downtown Eugene stores soon were donated by Kaye Loomis, and photography for the posters was done free of charge by Dotson's Photo Shop, Mrs. Bissell said.

30 Children
The facilities of the present hospital school at 1166 Alder St. can care for 30 children. Clinics are held once a month to provide consistent progress of the treatment need, and after the next clinic the school will be filled to capacity with a long waiting list.

Children from all over the state are accepted at the school, and it is estimated that more than 400 children are registered with the Crippled Children's Division of the University of Oregon Medical School who are in need of and could benefit by services offered exclusively at the Eugene school.

Building Planned
In order to meet the demand, plans for a building with 50 dormitory beds and classrooms and treatment facilities for 80 students are being developed. The cost of the new building will be about \$250,000.

The school, which is mainly administered locally, is the main project of the Oregon Society for Crippled Children and Adults.

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Next UO Talk By Dr. Wolff

Dr. Lucien Wolff, professor of English literature at the Facultes des Lettres, University of Rennes, France, will be the next speaker on the University of Oregon lecture series, Dr. Rudolf Ernst, head of the faculty committee, announced Friday.

Dr. Wolff will speak on Andre Gide, Nobel prize winner, at 8 p.m. Thursday in Room 207, Chapman hall, on the campus.

During the past two academic years, Wolff has been a visiting

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professor at the University of California. Previously he had been visiting professor of French at Cornell University in 1946-47, and at the University of Buffalo, N.Y., during 1935-36 and 1938-39.

The French professor holds the degrees of Agrege de l'Universite and Doctorat es Lettres from the University of Sorbonne, Paris, and also was awarded a master of arts degree from the University of Cambridge in England, where he taught French for two years. He was Chancellor at the University of Rennes during the war but resigned from that position to return to teaching.

The university lectures are open to the public and there is no admission charge.

UO Extension Division Adds Beginning German

First-year German has been added to the curriculum of the general extension division of the State System of Higher Education, Miss Mozelle Hair, head of correspondence study, announced Friday.

Prepared by Rudolph Ottenbacher, instructor of German at the University of Oregon, the course is designed to parallel university classroom offering and carries full credit.

A second-year course is now being written by Ottenbacher and should be available this school year.

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
