High Schools to Get UO Summer Session

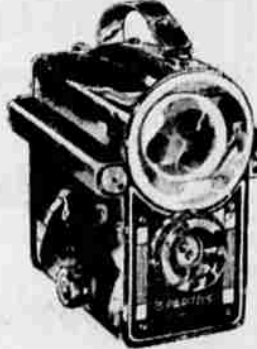
