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Norway Talks Peace with US

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Rep. Henry Jackson (D-Wash.) said Thursday he is confident Norway already has "cast its lot with the West" and will join the North Atlantic Defense Alliance.

Jackson made the statement to a reporter after an off-the-record talk with Halvard M. Lange, Norway's visiting foreign minister.

Lange will see President Truman Friday to discuss his country's defense problems.

Lange is in the midst of secret discussions with the State Department which will help his country make up its mind whether to turn to Russia or the United States-sponsored alliance for future safety from attack.

"There can be no retreat from the Democratic stand the Norwegians have taken," Jackson said. He added he believes Congress would give top priority to giving arms for Norway "because of its geographical position."

Norway's far northern frontier borders Russia, which has been bitterly assailing the North Atlantic alliance as an "aggressive" move by the Western powers.

Secretary of State Acheson emphatically rejected this Russian accusation at his news conference Wednesday. On the contrary, he said, the alliance, now in the final stages of negotiation, is a step to help the United Nations keep peace.

Rep. Jackson sponsored a luncheon for Foreign Minister Lange Wednesday at Capitol Hill in order to help give him the congressional view of the international defense picture.

The Norwegian diplomat has been carefully examining the benefits and obligations of the Atlantic pact during three days of conferences with top State Department officials.

Two more countries — Sweden and Denmark — took their defense problems to Acheson Wednesday with brief calls by their ambassadors.

Gold-Mining Declines 5 Per Cent in 1948

WASHINGTON — (AP) — A gold-mining post-war upturn toward pre-war levels halted in 1948 and production declined 5 per cent, the Bureau of Mines said Thursday.

Mine production of silver increased 5 per cent, however, and at 37,790,083 ounces was the largest since 1943.

The bureau's preliminary estimates placed 1948 gold production at 2,001,380 ounces.

Largest declines were in Alaska and Utah, but final data for the territory may reduce the Alaskan loss, the bureau said. Utah's 50,000-ounce decline was due to a year-end work stoppage at the nation's largest copper mine producing gold as a byproduct.

Colorado and Idaho production declined 9 and 7 per cent respectively. Increases were recorded in Arizona, 12 per cent, Nevada 30 per cent, and Washington 107 per cent.

"The more than doubling of production in Washington in 1948 resulted from the very large increase at the Holden Mine, Chelan County."

Gold production, by states, included:

California, 418,490 ounces; Washington, 72,395; Idaho, 60,600; Oregon, 15,060; Alaska, 226,323.

The 1948 silver production, by states, included:

Idaho, 11,550,000 ounces; Washington, 368,450; Alaska, 58,497.
